CRIME PREVENTION POWERS BILL 1998

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

OUTLINE

The purpose of this Bill is to provide for a police officer who, having reasonable grounds, would be able to direct a person to leave a public place. The Bill has no financial implications.

CLAUSE NOTES

Clauses 1, and 2 are formal requirements. They refer to the short title of the Bill; specify that the Bill will commence upon being notified in the *Gazette*; and identify the title of the Act being amended.

Clause 3 provides the interpretation of "public place" and "violent conduct".

Clause 4 outlines the provision whereby a police officer may direct a person to leave a public place. The penalty for not following such a direction without a reasonable excuse is 2 penalty units (currently \$200). This Bill does not apply to people engaged in the activity of picketing a place of employment; demonstrating or protesting about a particular matter; or publicly speaking or identifying with a banner.
