APPROPRIATION BILL (No 2) 1999-2000

The Appropriation Bill (No 2) 1999-2000 provides for the appropriation of moneys for the financial year 1999-2000.

Under Section 58 of the Australian Capital Territory (Self-Government) Act 1988, public money may not be issued or spent except as authorised by law. Under Section 6 of the Financial Management Act 1996, no payment of public money may be made unless it is in accordance with an appropriation.

The Bill provides for the following appropriations:

- (a) a capital injection of \$3 million to the Department of Health and Community Care;
- (b) a capital injection of \$4.5 million to the Chief Minister's Department to be onpassed to the Canberra Tourism and Events Corporation; and
- (c) Government Payment for Outputs of \$2.5 million to the Chief Minister Department to be onpassed to the Canberra Tourism and Events Corporation

APPROPRIATION BILL (No 2) 1999-2000

Clause 1 cites the short title of the Act as being the Appropriation Act (No 2) 1999-2000 as it relates to the 1999-2000 financial year.

Clause 2 provides that the Act commences on the day it is notified in the Gazette.

Clause 3 refers to the legislative basis for making appropriations.

Clause 4 deals with interpretation for the purposes of the Bill.

Clause 5 provides for the appropriation of \$10 million to the Chief Minister's Department and the Department of Health and Community Care

Clause 5.1 provides for the appropriation of \$4.5 million capital injection to the Chief Minister's Department in the financial year 1999-2000.

Clause 5.2 provides for the appropriation of \$2.5 million to the Chief Minister's Department for the net cost of providing outputs in the financial year 1999-2000.

Clause 5.3 provides for the appropriation of \$3 million capital injection to the Department of Health and Community Care in the financial year 1999-2000.
