

THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

No. 4 of 1932.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Canberra University College Ordinance 1929.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act* 1909 and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act* 1910-1931, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Canberra University College Ordinance* 1932. Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Canberra University College Ordinance* 1929 is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Canberra University College Ordinance* 1929-1932.

2. Section five of the Principal Ordinance is amended by inserting, at the beginning thereof, the words "Subject to the next succeeding section,". The Council of the College.

3. Section six of the Principal Ordinance is amended— Members of Council how appointed.

(a) by inserting in sub-section (1.), after the word "Council", the words "(other than the additional member referred to in sub-section (2A.) of this section)"; and

(b) by inserting, after sub-section (2.), the following sub-section:—

"(2A.) The Council may co-opt a member of the teaching staff of the College to be an additional member of the Council for such term not exceeding two years as the Council thinks fit."

4. Section eight of the Principal Ordinance is amended— Resignation from office.

(a) by inserting, after the word "Council", the words "(other than the additional member)"; and

(b) by adding at the end thereof the following subsection:—

“(2.) The additional member may resign his office by writing addressed to the Chairman”.
