

AUSTRALIAN CAPITAL TERRITORY.

AN ORDINANCE

To enable the United States Educational Foundation in Australia to acquire and deal with property, and for other purposes.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909-1938* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1947*, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *United States Educational Foundation in Australia Ordinance 1950*.* Short title.

2. In this Ordinance, unless the contrary intention appears— Definitions.

“the Chairman” means the Honorary Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Foundation, being the principal officer in charge of the Diplomatic Mission of the United States of America in Australia;

“the Foundation” means the United States Educational Foundation in Australia established under an agreement dated the twenty-sixth day of November, One thousand nine hundred and forty-nine, made between the Government of the United States of America and the Government of Australia.

3. The Foundation shall, in the name of “United States Educational Foundation in Australia”, be capable of— Powers of Foundation.

- (a) acquiring (whether as grantee or transferee), holding and disposing of or otherwise dealing with real and personal property; and
- (b) being registered in any public register as the owner, proprietor, lessee or holder of any such property.

4. Any instrument or other document signed by the Chairman in his own name on behalf of the Foundation shall be deemed to be executed or signed by the Foundation. Authentication of instruments.

Service of
documents.

5. Any notice, process or other document may, for the purposes of any law of the Territory, be served upon or given to the Foundation—

- (a) by leaving it at the office of the Foundation at Canberra with some person apparently in the service of the Foundation; or
- (b) by sending it by registered post to the Foundation at that office.
