AN ORDINANCE

To make Lawful the Sale of Liquor at certain Commonwealth Boarding Establishments during a Period of Celebration of the Jubilee of the Commonwealth.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909-1938* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1947*, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Liquor Ordinance 1951*.^{*} Short title.

2. In this Ordinance—

Definitions.

“liquor” has the same meaning as it has in the *Liquor Ordinance 1929-1950*;

“the prescribed period” means the period commencing on the eleventh day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-one, and ending on the sixteenth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-one.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the *Liquor Ordinance 1929-1950*, the person managing, on behalf of the Commonwealth, each of the residential premises in Canberra known as Havelock House and Hotel Kurrajong respectively may, on behalf of the Commonwealth and subject to the directions of the Minister, sell and supply liquor, at any time during the prescribed period, to a lodger at those premises for consumption on those premises by the lodger or by a guest of the lodger.
