

THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

No. 2 of 1914.

AN ORDINANCE

For the Purpose of Preventing the Pollution of the Cotter River.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910*, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Cotter River Ordinance 1914*. Short title

2.—(1.) No person shall, without the permission in writing of the Administrator (proof whereof shall lie upon him), fish for any fish, or use any device for taking fish, in any waters comprised in the area described in the Schedule to this Ordinance. Fishing in Cotter River and tributaries

Penalty: Ten pounds or imprisonment for one month.

(2.) In this section the word “taking” includes catching and all other means by which fish may be procured from the water.

(3.) Any person who appears to be acting in contravention of sub-section (1.) of this section shall, on request by any person thereto authorized by the Administrator, and on production of such authority, give his name and place of residence; and any person who refuses to comply with such request, or who gives a false name or false place of residence, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

3. No person shall without the permission in writing of the Administrator (proof whereof shall lie upon him), camp or picnic upon the area described in the Schedule to this Ordinance. Camping or picnicking on Cotter River catchment area.

Penalty: Twenty pounds or imprisonment for three months.

SCHEDULE.

All that piece or parcel of land situate in the County of Cowley and within the Federal Territory commencing at the intersection of the left bank of the Cotter River with the Murrumbidgee River and bounded thence by the left bank of the Cotter River aforesaid to its intersection with the western boundary of Portion 184 Parish of Urayarra thence by the continuation southerly of that boundary across the Cotter River aforesaid thence by a ridge generally south-westerly partly through Portions 136 and 137 to Trigonometrical Station Hardy thence on the east south and west by the ranges forming the eastern southern and western watersheds respectively of the Cotter River aforesaid to Trigonometrical Station Mount Coree thence on the north-west by part of the north-western boundary of the Federal Territory being a line bearing 54 degrees 20 minutes and distant about 220 chains from that Trigonometrical Station to a range forming the northern watershed of the Cotter River thence on the north by that watershed to Trigonometrical Station Mount McDonald thence on the north-east by a straight line from that Trigonometrical Station to the point of commencement.
