

THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

No. 3 of 1932.

AN ORDINANCE

For the Protection of the Arms of the City of Canberra.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General of the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act* 1909 and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act* 1910-1931, as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *City of Canberra Arms Ordinance* 1932. Short title.

2. The *Federal Capital Commission's Arms Ordinance* 1929 is repealed. Repeals.

3. In this Ordinance, unless the contrary intention appears— Definitions.

“City of Canberra Arms” means the Arms and Crest of the City of Canberra granted by Royal Warrant to the Federal Capital Commissioners, Australia, appointed under the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act* 1924-1928, and their successors in their corporate capacity, and includes the Supporters to those Arms.

4.—(1.) Any person who, without the authority of the Minister (proof whereof shall lie upon the person accused), assumes or uses in connexion with any trade, business, calling or profession, the City of Canberra Arms or Arms or any device or design so nearly resembling the City of Canberra Arms as to be likely to deceive shall be guilty of an offence. Unauthorized use of City of Canberra Arms.

Penalty: Twenty Pounds.

(2.) Without limiting the meaning of the preceding subsection, the City of Canberra Arms or Arms or any device or design so nearly resembling the City of Canberra Arms as to be likely to deceive shall be deemed to be assumed or used by a person in connexion with any trade, business, calling or profession if

they are applied (whether as a trade mark or otherwise) to any goods manufactured, produced, sold or offered for sale by that person.
