An Act for the Protection of the Arms of the City of Canberra

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the *City of Canberra Arms Act 1932*.¹

Repeal

2. The *Federal Capital Commission's Arms Ordinance 1929* is repealed.

Interpretation

3. In this Act, unless the contrary intention appears—

“City of Canberra Arms” means the Arms and Crest of the City of Canberra granted by Royal Warrant to the Federal Capital Commissioners, Australia, appointed under the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1924-1928*, and their successors in their corporate capacity, and includes the Supporters to those Arms.

Unauthorised use of City of Canberra Arms

4. (1) Any person who, without the authority of the Minister (proof whereof shall lie upon the person accused), assumes or uses in connexion with any trade, business, calling or profession, the City of Canberra Arms or Arms or any device or design so nearly resembling the City of Canberra Arms as to be likely to deceive shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty: Forty dollars.

(2) Without limiting the meaning of the preceding subsection, the City of Canberra Arms or Arms or any device or design so nearly resembling the City of Canberra Arms as to be likely to deceive shall be deemed to be assumed or used by a person in connexion with any trade, business, calling or profession if they are applied (whether as a trade mark or otherwise) to any goods manufactured, produced, sold or offered for sale by that person.

NOTE

1. The *City of Canberra Arms Act 1932* as shown in this reprint comprises Act No. 3, 1932 amended as indicated in the Tables below.

Citation of Laws—The *Self-Government (Citation of Laws) Act 1989* (No. 21, 1989) altered the citation of most Ordinances so that after Self-Government day they are to be cited as Acts. That Act also affects references in ACT laws to Commonwealth Acts.
