About this republication

The republished law

This is a republication of the *City of Canberra Arms Act 1932*, including any amendment made under the *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 (Editorial changes), as in force on 16 July 2002. It also includes any amendment, repeal or expiry affecting the republished law to 12 September 2001.

The legislation history and amendment history of the republished law are set out in endnotes 3 and 4.

Kinds of republications

The Parliamentary Counsel's Office prepares 2 kinds of republications of ACT laws (see the ACT legislation register at www.legislation.act.gov.au):

- authorised republications to which the *Legislation Act 2001* applies
- unauthorised republications.

The status of this republication appears on the bottom of each page.

Editorial changes

The *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 authorises the Parliamentary Counsel to make editorial amendments and other changes of a formal nature when preparing a law for republication. Editorial changes do not change the effect of the law, but have effect as if they had been made by an Act commencing on the republication date (see *Legislation Act 2001*, s 115 and s 117). The changes are made if the Parliamentary Counsel considers they are desirable to bring the law into line, or more closely into line, with current legislative drafting practice.

This republication includes amendments made under part 11.3 (see endnote 1).

Uncommenced provisions and amendments

If a provision of the republished law has not commenced or is affected by an uncommenced amendment, the symbol **U** appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the uncommenced provision or amendment appears only in the last endnote.

Modifications

If a provision of the republished law is affected by a current modification, the symbol **M** appears immediately before the provision heading. The text of the modifying provision appears in the endnotes. For the legal status of modifications, see *Legislation Act 2001*, section 95.

Penalties

The value of a penalty unit for an offence against this republished law at the republication date is—

- (a) if the person charged is an individual—\$100; or
- (b) if the person charged is a corporation—\$500.

An Act for the protection of the arms of the City of Canberra

1 Name of Act

This Act is the *City of Canberra Arms Act 1932*.

3 Meaning of *City of Canberra Arms*

In this Act:

Note A definition applies except so far as the contrary intention appears (see *Legislation Act 2001*, s 155).

City of Canberra Arms means the Arms and Crest of the City of Canberra granted by royal warrant to the Federal Capital Commissioners, Australia, appointed under the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1924* (Cwlth), and their successors in their corporate capacity, and includes the Supporters to those Arms.

4 Unauthorised use of *City of Canberra Arms*

- (1) Any person who, without the authority of the Minister (proof of which shall lie on the person accused), assumes or uses in connection with any trade, business, calling or profession, the City of Canberra Arms or arms or any device or design so nearly resembling the City of Canberra Arms as to be likely to deceive shall be guilty of an offence.

Maximum penalty: 30 penalty units.

- (2) Without limiting the meaning of the subsection (1), the City of Canberra Arms or arms or any device or design so nearly resembling the City of Canberra Arms as to be likely to deceive shall be deemed to be assumed or used by a person in connection with any trade, business, calling or profession if they are applied (whether as a trade mark or otherwise) to any goods manufactured, produced, sold or offered for sale by that person.

1 About the endnotes

Amending and modifying laws are annotated in the legislation history and the amendment history. Current modifications are not included in the republished law but are set out in the endnotes.

Not all editorial amendments made under the *Legislation Act 2001*, part 11.3 are annotated in the amendment history. Full details of any amendments can be obtained from the Parliamentary Counsel's Office.

Uncommenced amending laws and expiries are listed in the legislation history and the amendment history. These details are underlined. Uncommenced provisions and amendments are not included in the republished law but are set out in the last endnote.

If all the provisions of the law have been renumbered, a table of renumbered provisions gives details of previous and current numbering.

The endnotes also include a table of earlier republications.

If the republished law includes penalties, current information about penalty unit values appears on the republication inside front cover.

3 Legislation history

3 Legislation history

This Act was originally a Commonwealth ordinance—the *City of Canberra Ordinance 1932* No 3 (Cwlth).

The *Australian Capital Territory (Self-Government) Act 1988* (Cwlth), s 34 (4) converted most former Commonwealth ordinances in force in the ACT into ACT enactments. This allowed the ACT Legislative Assembly to amend and repeal the laws. This Act was converted into an ACT enactment on 11 May 1989 (self-government day).

As with most ordinances in force in the ACT, the name was changed from *Ordinance* to *Act* by the *Self-Government (Citation of Laws) Act 1989* No 21, s 5 on 11 May 1989 (self-government day).

Before 11 May 1989, ordinances commenced on their notification day unless otherwise stated (see *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910* (Cwlth), s 12).
