THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

No. 22 of 1933.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Dentists Registration Ordinance 1931-1932.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933*, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Dentists Registration Ordinance 1933*. Short title.

(2.) The *Dentists Registration Ordinance 1931-1932* is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Dentists Registration Ordinance 1931-1933*.

2. Section nine of the Principal Ordinance is repealed and the following section inserted in its stead:—

“9. The Governor-General may, if satisfied that any member has been guilty of misbehaviour or is incapacitated, remove the member from office.” Removal of member from office.

3. Section thirty of the Principal Ordinance is amended by adding at the end of sub-section (4.) the words “whose decision shall be final and conclusive and without appeal”. Cancellation of registration for fraud and on other grounds.

4. After section thirty-eight of the Principal Ordinance the following section is inserted:—

“38A. A registered dentist shall be entitled to sue in any Court of competent jurisdiction for the recovery of his fees or other remuneration for his professional services in dentistry or in the performance of any dental operation or for any dental attendance or advice, and it shall be sufficient to state in the particulars of demand the words “for dental services” which shall include every demand for any dental operation, attendance and advice and for any articles supplied by the plaintiff to the defendant for dental purposes.” Registered dentist may sue for fees, &c.

5. Section forty of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting from sub-section (2.) the words "and may be enforced in the same manner as the order of a Court of summary jurisdiction" and inserting in their stead the words "The amount specified in any such order shall be a debt due to the Crown and may be sued for and recovered by action instituted by any officer authorized in writing by the Director-General of Health in any Court of Petty Sessions as a civil debt recoverable summarily".

6. After section forty-one of the Principal Ordinance the following section is inserted:—

Penalty for
offences where
no special
penalty
provided.

"41A. Any person who commits any breach of the provisions of this Ordinance, for which a penalty is not specially provided, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding Fifty pounds."
