

# THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

No. 5 of 1933.

## AN ORDINANCE

### To amend the Meat Ordinance 1931.

**B**E it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1930*, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Meat Ordinance* Short title.  
1933.

(2.) The *Meat Ordinance 1931* is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Meat Ordinance 1931-1933*.

2. The Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting Section 17 and inserting in its stead the following:—

“17. The Minister may from time to time determine the fees, charges or prices in respect of— Minister to fix fees, &c.

- (a) the lairage, pasturage, examination or slaughter of animals at public abattoirs or approved slaughtering places;
- (b) the chilling or storage of meat at the abattoir;
- (c) the acquisition or treatment of fat, bones, viscera, offal or condemned meat under this Ordinance.
- (d) the disposal of tallow, blood, bone-meal or other products produced at abattoirs; or
- (e) salting, rolling, drying or other treatment of hides or skins.”
