THE TERRITORY FOR THE SEAT OF GOVERNMENT.

No. 24 of 1936.

AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Poisons and Dangerous Drugs Ordinance 1933.

BE it ordained by the Deputy of the Governor-General in and
over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the
Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred
by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act* 1909 and the *Seat of
Government (Administration) Act* 1910-1933, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Poisons and Dangerous Drugs Ordinance* 1936. Short title
and citation.

(2.) The *Poisons and Dangerous Drugs Ordinance* 1933 is in
this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance,
may be cited as the *Poisons and Dangerous Drugs Ordinance*
1933-1936.

2. Section nine of the Principal Ordinance is amended by Appointment
of analysts. omitting sub-section (1.) and inserting in its stead the following
sub-section:—

“(1.) The Minister may appoint any person—

(a) who is a Fellow or Associate of the Australian Chemical
Institute; or

(b) who, in the opinion of the Minister, holds qualifications
equivalent to those required for admission as a Fellow
or Associate of that Institute,

to be an analyst for the purposes of this Ordinance.”
