## AN ORDINANCE

### To amend the Police Offences Ordinance 1930-1937.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909-1938* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1933*, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Police Offences Ordinance 1939*. Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Police Offences Ordinance 1930-1937*, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Police Offences Ordinance 1930-1939*.

2. After section thirty-five of the *Police Offences Ordinance 1930-1937* the following section is inserted:—

“35A.—(1.) All machines, commonly known as fruit machines, poker machines or flag machines and all similar machines are unlawful machines and are forfeited to the King. Prohibition against fruit, &c., machines.”

(2.) Any person who has in his possession or custody, or under his control, any unlawful machine, or who suffers or permits any unlawful machine to be kept, or used, or to be in operation, on premises of which he is the owner, occupier, manager or licensee, or of which he is in charge, shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty: Fifty pounds.”
