AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Trespass on Commonwealth Lands Ordinance 1932-1940.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909-1938* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1940*, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Trespass on Commonwealth Lands Ordinance 1942*.^{*} Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Trespass on Commonwealth Lands Ordinance 1932-1940*, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Trespass on Commonwealth Lands Ordinance 1932-1942*.

2. After section four A of the *Trespass on Commonwealth Lands Ordinance 1932-1940* the following section is inserted:—

“4B. Any person who turns loose, or suffers any animal belonging to him or under his charge to be tethered or depastured, on any road or unleased land belonging to the Commonwealth in the City Area shall be guilty of an offence. Grazing stock on Commonwealth land in City area.

Penalty: Ten pounds.”.
