AN ORDINANCE

To amend the Medical Practitioners Registration Ordinance 1930-1939.

BE it ordained by the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Seat of Government Acceptance Act 1909-1938* and the *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910-1947*, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Medical Practitioners Registration Ordinance 1950*.*

Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Medical Practitioners Registration Ordinance 1930-1939*, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Medical Practitioners Registration Ordinance 1930-1950*.

2. Section thirty-four of the *Medical Practitioners Registration Ordinance 1930-1939* is amended by inserting after paragraph (a) of sub-section (1.) the following paragraph:—

No person other than a registered medical practitioner to practise medicine.

“(aa) treat, with or without fee or reward, any person for cancer in any form, tuberculosis in any form, diabetes in any form or venereal disease;”.
