PHARMACY ORDINANCE 1973

1. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Pharmacy Ordinance 1973*.^{*} Short title and citation.

(2) The *Pharmacy Ordinance 1931-1972*,[†] as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Pharmacy Ordinance 1931-1973*.

2. Section 38 of the *Pharmacy Ordinance 1931-1972* is amended by omitting paragraph (c) of sub-section (1) and substituting the following word and paragraph:— Pharmaceutical appointments not to be held by unregistered persons.

“or (c) sell or have in his possession for the purposes of sale—

(i) any medicated wine; or

(ii) any prescribed drug, preparation or article.”
