About this republication

The republished law

Editorial changes do not change the effect of the law, but have effect as if they had been made by an Act commencing on the republication date (see *Legislation Act 2001*, s 115 and s 117). The changes are made if the Parliamentary Counsel considers they are desirable to bring the law into line, or more closely into line, with current legislative drafting practice.

National Exhibition Centre Trust Act 1976

An Act to establish a National Exhibition Centre Trust

Part 1 Preliminary

1 Short title

This Act may be cited as the *National Exhibition Centre Trust Act 1976*.

2 Definitions for Act

In this Act:

Note A definition applies except so far as the contrary intention appears (see *Legislation Act 2001*, s 155).

by-laws means by-laws made by the trust under this Act.

chairperson means the chairperson of the trust.

deputy chairperson means the member holding office under section 9 (1).

member means—

- (a) the chairperson; or
- (b) a member of the trust other than the chairperson.

national exhibition centre means the land described in schedule 1.

trust means the National Exhibition Centre Trust established by section 3.

Part 2 Establishment, functions, powers and duties of trust

3 Establishment of trust

- (1) There shall be a body to be known as the National Exhibition Centre Trust.
- (2) The body that existed by virtue of the section for which this section was substituted, under the name of the Canberra Showground Trust continues in existence, by force of this subsection, under the name of the National Exhibition Centre Trust.
- (3) The alteration of name effected by subsection (2) does not affect any property, powers, rights, authorities, duties, functions, liabilities or obligations of the trust continued in existence by force of that subsection or render defective any legal or other proceedings instituted or to be instituted by or against the trust, and any legal or other proceedings may be continued or commenced by or against the trust by the name of the National Exhibition Centre Trust that might have been continued or commenced by or against the trust by the name of the Canberra Showground Trust.
- (4) All courts, judges and persons acting judicially shall take judicial notice of—
 - (a) the seal of the National Exhibition Centre Trust affixed to a document after the commencement of this section; and
 - (b) the seal of the Canberra Showground Trust affixed to a document before the commencement of this section.

4 Functions of trust

The functions of the trust are—

- (a) to manage the national exhibition centre; and

- (b) to conduct, on the national exhibition centre, exhibitions and shows and sporting, recreational and cultural activities; and
- (c) to conduct, on the national exhibition centre, such other activities as the Minister approves; and
- (d) to provide, on the national exhibition centre, such buildings, structures, arenas and facilities, whether permanent or temporary, as are necessary for, or incidental to, the conduct of the exhibitions, shows and activities referred to in paragraph (b) or (c); and
- (e) to conduct, on land held by the trust under lease, such activities or undertakings as the trust thinks fit, being activities or undertakings that are authorised by the lease of the land.

5 Powers of trust

- (1) Subject to this Act, the trust has power to do all things necessary or convenient to be done for or in connection with, or as incidental to, the performance of its functions under this Act and, in particular, has power—
 - (a) to hold land under lease and to assign or surrender leases; and
 - (b) to grant subleases; and
 - (c) to acquire, hold and dispose of personal property; and
 - (d) to enter into contracts, other than contracts of employment; and
 - (f) to grant licences to persons to use the national exhibition centre, or part of the national exhibition centre, or land held by the trust under lease for purposes for which the trust is authorised to use the national exhibition centre or that land; and
 - (g) to make charges for admission to the national exhibition centre and land held by the trust under lease; and
 - (h) to grant, subject to such charges and other terms and conditions as the trust thinks fit, rights to televise, broadcast, film or

record activities conducted at the national exhibition centre or on land held by the trust under lease; and

- (j) to make charges for the use of facilities and services provided by the trust at the national exhibition centre or on land held by the trust under lease; and
 - (k) to advertise and promote activities conducted at the national exhibition centre or on land held by the trust; and
 - (l) to give prizes and awards to persons in connection with activities conducted at the national exhibition centre or on land held by the trust under lease.
- (2) Except with the approval of the Minister, the trust shall not—
- (a) hold land under a lease other than a lease granted by the Commonwealth; or
 - (b) erect buildings on the national exhibition centre or on land held by the trust under lease; or
 - (c) enter into a contract involving the payment or receipt of an amount exceeding \$50 000; or
 - (d) carry out, or join in carrying out, works on land other than land of which the trust has the control or is the lessee; or
 - (e) assign or mortgage a lease; or
 - (f) grant a sublease for a term exceeding 1 year.

6 Policy

- (1) The Minister may give directions to the trust with respect to the general policy, including the financial policy, to be adopted by the trust and the trust shall comply with any directions so given.
- (2) Subject to any directions given by the Minister under subsection (1), the trust shall pursue a financial policy directed towards securing revenue sufficient to meet all its expenditure properly chargeable against revenue.

Part 3 Constitution and meetings of trust

7 Constitution of trust

- (1) The trust—
 - (a) is a body corporate; and
 - (b) shall have a seal; and
 - (c) may sue and be sued in its corporate name.
- (2) All courts, judges and persons acting judicially shall take judicial notice of the seal of the trust affixed to a document and shall presume that it was duly affixed.

8 Membership of trust

- (1) The trust is to consist of—
 - (a) the chairperson of the trust; and
 - (b) a public servant; and
 - (c) not less than 5 or more than 7 other members.
- (3) The members shall be appointed by the Minister.
- (4) Subject to this Act, the member referred to in subsection (1) (b) ceases to be a member if he or she ceases to be a public servant.
- (6) A member referred to in subsection (1) (a) or (c) holds office for such period, not exceeding 3 years, as is specified in the relevant instrument of appointment.
- (7) A member is eligible for reappointment.
- (8) The performance of the functions, or the exercise of the powers, of the trust is not affected by reason of there being a vacancy or vacancies in the membership of the trust.

9 Deputy chairperson

- (1) The trust shall appoint a member to be the deputy chairperson of the trust.
- (2) The member appointed as deputy chairperson holds office until the expiration of his or her term of office as a member that is current at the time of his or her appointment but ceases to be the deputy chairperson if he or she ceases to be a member or resigns his or her office of deputy chairperson.
- (3) The member appointed as deputy chairperson may resign his or her office of deputy chairperson by writing under his or her hand delivered to the chairperson or, if the office of chairperson is vacant or the chairperson is absent from the Territory, to the Minister.
- (4) A member is eligible to be reappointed as deputy chairperson.

11 Resignation of members

A member may resign his or her office of member by writing under his or her hand delivered to the Minister.

12 Termination of appointment

- (1) The Minister may remove a member from office on the ground of misbehaviour, physical or mental incapacity or invalidity.
- (2) If a member—
 - (a) becomes bankrupt, applies to take the benefit of any law for the relief of bankrupt or insolvent debtors, compounds with his or her creditors or makes an assignment of his or her remuneration for their benefit; or
 - (b) is absent without leave of the trust from 3 consecutive meetings of the trust; or
 - (c) without reasonable excuse, fails to comply with his or her obligations under section 13;

the Minister shall remove him or her from office.

- (3) The Minister may at any time terminate the appointment of the member referred to in section 8 (1) (b).

13 Disclosure of pecuniary interest

- (1) A member who has a direct or indirect pecuniary interest in a matter being considered or about to be considered by the trust shall, as soon as possible after the relevant facts have come to his or her knowledge, disclose the nature of his or her interest at a meeting of the trust.
- (2) A disclosure under subsection (1) shall be recorded in the minutes of the meeting of the trust and the member shall not, unless the Minister or the trust otherwise determines—
- (a) be present during any deliberation of the trust with respect to that matter; or
 - (b) take part in any decision of the trust with respect to that matter.
- (3) For the purpose of making a determination by the trust under subsection (2) in relation to a member who has made a disclosure under subsection (1), a member who has a direct or indirect pecuniary interest in a matter to which the disclosure relates shall not—
- (a) be present during any deliberation of the trust for the purpose of making the determination; or
 - (b) take part in the making by the trust of the determination.

15 Leave of absence

The Minister may grant leave of absence to a member upon such terms and conditions as the trust determines.

16 Acting appointments

- (1) The Minister may, in writing, appoint a person to act as a member—
- (a) during a vacancy in the office of a member, whether or not an appointment has previously been made to the office; or

(b) during any period, or during all periods, when a member is absent from duty or from the Territory or is, for any other reason, unable to perform the functions of the office;

but a person appointed to act during a vacancy shall not continue so to act for more than 12 months.

(2) Anything done by, or in relation to, a person purporting to act under this section is not invalid on the ground that—

- (a) the occasion for the person's appointment had not arisen; or
- (b) there is a defect or irregularity in connection with the person's appointment; or
- (c) the person's appointment has ceased to have effect; or
- (d) the occasion for the action had not arisen.

17 Meetings of trust

- (1) The trust shall hold such meetings as are necessary for performance of its functions but so that not more than 2 months elapse between any 2 successive meetings.
- (2) The chairperson or, if for any reason the chairperson is not available, the deputy chairperson—
 - (a) may convene meetings of the trust; and
 - (b) shall, on receipt of a written request signed by 2 members, convene a meeting of the trust.
- (3) The chairperson and deputy chairperson shall comply with any directions of the trust with respect to the convening of meetings.
- (4) The chairperson shall preside at all meetings of the trust at which he or she is present.
- (5) At a meeting of the trust at which the chairperson is not present the deputy chairperson shall preside.
- (6) At a meeting of the trust—

- (a) if the number of persons holding office as members is not less than 7—4 members, of whom one is the chairperson or the deputy chairperson, constitute a quorum; and
 - (b) if the number of persons holding office as members is less than 7—3 members, of whom one is the chairperson or the deputy chairperson, constitute a quorum.
- (7) Questions arising at a meeting of the trust shall be determined by a majority of the votes of the members present and voting.
- (8) At a meeting of the trust, the member presiding has a deliberative vote and, in the event of equality of votes, also has a casting vote.

Part 4 Staff

18 Staff

- (1) The trust may make arrangements with the chief executive for the use of the services of public servants in the administrative unit under the chief executive's control.
- (2) The *Public Sector Management Act 1994* applies in relation to the management by the trust of public servants who are the subject of an arrangement under subsection (1).

Part 5 Finance

22 Application of money

- (1) The moneys of the trust may be applied by the trust—
 - (a) in payment or discharge of the costs, expenses or other obligations incurred by the trust in connection with the performance by the trust of its functions under this Act; and
 - (b) in payment of fees and allowances payable to members and to employees of the trust.

26 Profits of trust

- (1) For this Act, the profits of the trust for a financial year are the amount (if any) remaining after deducting from the revenue received or receivable in respect of that financial year in connection with the operations of the trust the expenditure, and provision for expenditure, properly chargeable against that revenue.
- (2) The profits of the trust for a financial year shall be applied in such manner as the Minister determines.
- (3) In making a determination under subsection (2), the Minister shall have regard to any advice given to him or her by the trust in relation to its financial affairs.

27 Liability for ACT taxes etc

The trust is not exempt from liability for any tax (however described), or any fee or charge, under a law of the Territory.

Part 6 By-laws

28 Power to make by-laws

- (1) The trust may, under its common seal and with the Minister's approval, make by-laws for this Act in relation to the management and control of the national exhibition centre.

Note By-laws must be notified, and presented to the Legislative Assembly, under the *Legislation Act 2001*.

- (2) The by-laws may make provision in relation to—
- (a) the regulation or prevention of the possession, supply and consumption of liquor within the meaning of the *Liquor Act 1975* at the national exhibition centre; and
 - (b) the regulation of admission of persons to, the removal of persons from, and the conduct of persons at, the national exhibition centre; and
 - (c) the regulation of traffic at the national exhibition centre.
- (3) The by-laws may prescribe offences for contraventions of the by-laws and prescribe maximum penalties of not more than 1 penalty unit for offences against the by-laws.

Part 7 Miscellaneous

29 Reports to Minister

The trust shall—

- (a) from time to time inform the Minister concerning the general conduct of its operations; and
- (b) furnish to the Minister such information relating to those operations as the Minister requires.

29A Annual reports to refer to approvals and directions

The trust shall include in each report it presents under the *Annual Reports (Government Agencies) Act 1995*, section 8 details of—

- (a) any approvals given by the Minister under section 4 (c), 5 (2) or 28 (1); and
 - (b) any direction given by the Minister under section 6 (1);
- during the period to which the report relates.

30 Saving

Nothing in this Act affects the operation of the *Racing Act 1999* or the *Gaming and Betting Act 1906*.

31 Regulation-making power

The Executive may make regulations for this Act.

Note Regulations must be notified, and presented to the Legislative Assembly, under the *Legislation Act 2001*.

Schedule 1 Description of national exhibition centre

(see s 2)

All that piece of land in the Canberra Central and Gungahlin Districts of the Australian Capital Territory containing an area of 40.4151ha more or less; commencing at a point on the northeastern side of Flemington Road on a line bearing $319^{\circ} 52' 50''$ for 87.813m from the intersection of that side of that road with the northwestern side of Northbourne Avenue as described in Computation Sheet D. 2120-6090 catalogued in the Australian Survey Office, Canberra; and bounded thence on the southwest by lines bearing consecutively $357^{\circ} 22' 30''$ for 329.369m and $349^{\circ} 08'$ for 204m; thence on the northwest by lines bearing consecutively 189.76m of an arc of radius 380m the chord of which lies to the southeast and bears $16^{\circ} 33' 30''$ for 187.794m, $25^{\circ} 26'$ for 55.22m, $37^{\circ} 10'$ for 25.218m and $56^{\circ} 12'$ for 83.565m; thence on the northeast by lines bearing consecutively 97° for 270m, 120° for 240m and 255.283m of an arc of radius 300m the chord of which lies to the southwest and bears $164^{\circ} 9' 50''$ for 247.65m; thence on the southeast by a line bearing $229^{\circ} 51' 55''$ for 778.512m; thence by a straight line to the point of commencement.

3 Legislation history

The *National Exhibition Centre Trust Act 1976* was originally the *Canberra Showground Trust Ordinance 1976*. It became an ACT Act on self-government (11 May 1989).

Before 11 May 1989, ordinances commenced on notification day unless otherwise stated (see *Seat of Government (Administration) Act 1910* (Cwlth), s 12).

After 11 May 1989 and before 10 November 1999, Acts commenced on notification day unless otherwise stated (see *Australian Capital Territory (Self-Government) Act 1988* (Cwlth), s 25).
