### To amend the *Surveyors Ordinance 1967*

### SURVEYORS (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE 1978

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Surveyors (Amendment) Ordinance 1978*.<sup>\*</sup> Short title
2. In this Ordinance, "Principal Ordinance" means the *Surveyors Ordinance 1967*. Principal Ordinance
3. Section 4 of the Principal Ordinance is amended— Definitions
  - (a) by inserting after the definition of "certificate of registration" the following definition:  
" 'Department' means the department of State administered by the Minister of State for the time being administering this Ordinance;"; and
  - (b) by inserting after the definition of "registered surveyor" the following definition:  
" 'Secretary' means the person who, for the time being, is, or is performing the duties of, the Permanent Head of the Department within the meaning of the *Public Service Act 1922*;"
4. Section 14 of the Principal Ordinance is amended— Registrar of Surveyors
  - (a) by omitting "to the Department of the Interior"; and

(b) by omitting " who is an officer of the Department of the Interior ".

**5.** Section 17 of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting from paragraph (1) (a) " twenty-one " and substituting " 18 ".

**6.** Section 44 of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting from paragraph (2) (a) " of the Interior ".
