An Ordinance to amend the *Liquor Ordinance 1975*

LIQUOR (AMENDMENT) ORDINANCE (No. 3) 1979

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Liquor (Amendment) Ordinance (No. 3) 1979*.¹ Short title

2. In this Ordinance, "Principal Ordinance" means the *Liquor Ordinance 1975*.² Principal Ordinance

3. Section 34 of the Principal Ordinance is amended—

- (a) by omitting from sub-section (3) "issue or renewal" and substituting "issue"; and Conditions for issue and transfer of Club Licences
- (b) by omitting from sub-section (3) "or renewal, as the case may be".

4. Section 38 of the Principal Ordinance is amended—

- (a) by inserting " , subject to sub-section (2), " after "shall"; and Issue of renewal
- (b) by adding at the end thereof the following sub-section:

"(2) The Registrar shall not renew a Club Licence—

- (a) in the case of a licence issued before 1 June 1979—unless the applicant club, on the day immediately preceding the day on which the application for renewal was made, had not less than 150 financial members who had attained the age of 18 years; or

- (b) in the case of a licence issued on or after 1 June 1979—
unless the applicant club, on the day immediately preceding the day on which the application for renewal was made, had not less than 200 financial members who had attained the age of 18 years.”
