An Ordinance to amend the *Medical Practitioners Registration Ordinance 1930*

### Short title

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Medical Practitioners Registration (Amendment) Ordinance (No. 2) 1982*.<sup>1</sup>

### Principal Ordinance

2. In this Ordinance, "Principal Ordinance" means the *Medical Practitioners Registration Ordinance 1930*.<sup>2</sup>

3. Section 18 of the Principal Ordinance is repealed and the following section is substituted:

#### Payment of prescribed fees

"18. Where a prescribed fee is payable under this Ordinance, the prescribed fee shall be paid to the Capital Territory Health Commission."

#### Registration by the Board

4. Section 22 of the Principal Ordinance is amended

(a) by omitting sub-sections (2AA) and (2A) and substituting the following sub-section:

"(2A) An application for registration under this section shall be lodged with the Board together with a testimonial, diploma, licence or certificate testifying to each of the qualifications of the applicant."

(b) by omitting from paragraph (3) (d) "and" (last occurring):

(c) by adding at the end of sub-section (3) the following word and paragraph:

“; and (f) he has paid the prescribed fee or is a person who is exempted from the requirement to pay the prescribed fee by sub-section (3B).”; and

(d) by inserting after sub-section (3A) the following sub-section:

“(3B) A person who applies for registration under this section is not required to pay the prescribed fee referred to in paragraph (3) (f) if he is registered or licensed as a medical practitioner under a law of a State or Territory that provides for the registration or licensing of medical practitioners and is either—

- (a) an officer or employee within the meaning of the *Public Service Act* 1922; or
- (b) a member of the Defence Force engaged on continuous full-time service.”.
