An Act to amend the Legislative Assembly (Members' Staff) Act 1989

The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

J2008-320

1 Name of Act

This Act is the Legislative Assembly (Members' Staff) Amendment Act 2008.

2 Commencement

- (1) The following provisions commence on the day after the day the result of the 2008 general election of members of the Assembly is declared:
 - section 3;
 - section 5;
 - section 7;
 - section 8;
 - section 9.
- (2) The remaining provisions commence on the first sitting day after the day the result of the 2008 general election of members of the Assembly is declared.
 - *Note* The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on the notification day (see Legislation Act, s 75 (1)).

3 Legislation amended

This Act amends the Legislative Assembly (Members' Staff) Act 1989.

 - (a) if the consultant or contractor is an individual—is a family member of the member; or
 - (b) if the consultant or contractor is a corporation—has a director or other officer who is a family member of the member.
