An Act to amend the *Electoral Act 1992*

- *Note* The *Australian Capital Territory (Legislative Assembly) Act 2014* provides for the Legislative Assembly to consist of 25 members. It applies to the Legislative Assembly constituted by members elected at a general election after the commencement of that Act.
- (4) Subsection (3) and this subsection expire on 31 December 2016.
