



Declaration voting

If you are claiming a vote in the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Elected Body election but:

- your name cannot be found on the ACT electoral roll; or
- your name is incorrectly marked as having been issued with a ballot paper; or
- your right to vote has been challenged by the liaison officer,

you are entitled to cast a declaration vote.

Before you can be given a vote you will be asked to complete a declaration vote envelope.

Your right to vote will be checked by the ACT Electoral Commission and if required, by the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Elected Body Election Review Panel.
