STATUTORY DECLARATION

For use with Guardianship and Management of Property Applications

This declaration relates to the application to appoint a guardian or manager for:

make the following declaration under the *Statutory Declarations Act 1959*:

1. I have not been convicted or found guilty of an offence involving violence, fraud or dishonesty.
2. I have not been, either in the Territory or else where, refused appointment as a guardian or manager, or removed from office as a guardian or manager.
3. I am not bankrupt and have not applied to take the benefit of a law for the relief of bankrupt or insolvent debtors and have not compounded with creditors or made an assignment of income for their benefit.

(If any of the above do not apply, that is you have been convicted or found guilty of an offence involving violence, fraud or dishonesty, or you have been refused appointment as a guardian or manager, or removed from office as a guardian or manager, or you are bankrupt or have applied to take the benefit of a law for the relief of bankrupt or insolvent debtors, or have compounded with creditors or made an assignment of income for their benefit, you must delete which ever of the above does not apply and supply relevant details relating to any convictions, offences, bankruptcy or your refusal to be appointed guardian or manager below)
