Crimes Amendment Bill 2000

A BILL
FOR
An Act to amend the *Crimes Act 1900*

The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

1 Name of Act

This Act is the *Crimes Amendment Act 2000*.

5 2 Commencement

This Act commences on a day fixed by the Minister by notice in the Gazette.

Note 1 The provisions of an Act providing for its name and commencement automatically commence on the date of notification of the Act (*Interpretation Act 1967*, s 10B)

Note 2 A single day or time may be fixed, or different days or times may be fixed for different provisions (*Interpretation Act 1967*, s 10C (1))

Note 3 If a provision has not commenced within 6 months beginning on the date of notification of the Act, it automatically commences on the first day after that period
5 (*Interpretation Act 1967*, s 10E (2))

3 Act amended

This Act amends the *Crimes Act 1900*.

4 Insertion

After section 496 the following section is inserted:

10 **“497 Retail supplier of knives to display sign**

“(1) A person who sells knives by retail must display, in the immediate vicinity of each place where he or she displays knives for sale, a sign that complies with this section and that is clearly visible to a person in that place.

15 **Maximum penalty: 5 penalty units.**

“(2) The sign must display at least the following words in the following sequence:

‘It is an offence to sell a knife to a person under the age of 16.

Proof of age may be required.’.

20 **“(3) The lettering of the words stated in subsection (2) must be at least 8 mm in height.**

“(4) The dimensions of the sign must not be less than 210 mm x 145 mm.”.
