Agents Amendment Bill 2000

FOR

An Act to amend the Agents Act 1968

The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

1 Name of Act

This Act is the Agents Amendment Act 2000.

Commencement

This Act commences on the day it is notified in the Gazette.

3 Act amended

This Act amends the Agents Act 1968.

4 Substitution

Part 8A is omitted and the following Part substituted:

"PART 8A—CODES OF PRACTICE

"75A Approval of codes of practice

- "(1) The Minister may approve a code of practice for agents or a particular kind of agent.
- "(2) An approval is a disallowable instrument.

o "75B Complying with approved code of practice

An agent must comply with a code of practice that applies to the agent.

"75C Code of practice for use of sales information by real estate agents

- "(1) The Minister must approve a code of practice about the use of information about sales of land used for residential purposes (a *residential property*) by real estate agents.
 - "(2) In particular, the code of practice must provide to the effect that a real estate agent cannot advertise the price, or approximate price, at which a residential property is sold if a significant number of people living outside the immediate location of the property could identify the property from the advertisement.
 - "(3) This section does not limit the matters that may be included in the code of practice.
- "(4) The code of practice must be approved within 6 months of the commencement of this section.
 - "(5) This section ceases to have effect 7 months after the commencement of this section.".
