An Act to amend the *Public Sector Management Act 1994*, and for other purposes.

1 **1 Name of Act**

2 This Act is the *Public Sector Management Amendment Act*
3 *2005 (No 2)*.

4 **2 Commencement**

5 This Act commences on the day after its notification day.

6 *Note* The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on
7 the notification day (see Legislation Act, s 75 (1)).

8 **3 Legislation amended**

9 This Act amends the *Public Sector Management Act 1994*.

10 *Note* This Act also amends the following legislation (see sch 1):

- 11 • *Financial Management Act 1996*
- 12 • *Legislative Assembly (Broadcasting) Act 2001*.

19 **46 Clerk of Legislative Assembly**

- 20 (1) The office of Clerk of the Legislative Assembly is established.
21 (2) The Speaker must, on behalf of the Territory, appoint the clerk—
22 (a) on the advice of the appropriate standing committee of the
23 Legislative Assembly; and
24 (b) in consultation with the Leader of the Opposition; and

- 1 (c) in consultation with the Executive; and
2 (d) in accordance with the merit principles set out in section 65
3 that relate to the appointment.
4 (3) The clerk is not subject to direction by the Executive in the exercise
5 of the clerk's functions.

8 **48 Disclosure of interests by clerk**

9 The clerk must give a written statement of the clerk's personal and
10 financial interests to the Speaker within 7 days after—

- 11 (a) the day the clerk is appointed; and
12 (b) the first day of each financial year; and
13 (c) the day there is a change in an interest.

16 **50 Suspension and ending of appointment of clerk**

- 17 (1) The Speaker must end the clerk's appointment if the Legislative
18 Assembly resolves to require the Speaker to end the clerk's
19 appointment on the ground of misbehaviour or physical or mental
20 incapacity.
21 (2) The Speaker may suspend the clerk from duty for misbehaviour or
22 physical or mental incapacity.
23 (3) The Speaker must present to the Legislative Assembly a statement
24 of the reasons for the suspension on the first sitting day after the day
25 the clerk is suspended.

- 1 (4) If, within 3 sitting days after the day the statement is presented, the
2 Legislative Assembly resolves to require the Speaker to end the
3 clerk's appointment, the Speaker must end the clerk's appointment
4 under subsection (1).
- 5 (5) The clerk's suspension ends—
- 6 (a) if a statement of the reasons for the suspension is not presented
7 to the Legislative Assembly in accordance with
8 subsection (3)—at the end of the day the statement should have
9 been presented to the Assembly; or
- 10 (b) if, within 3 sitting days after the day the statement is presented,
11 the Assembly resolves in favour of ending the suspension or
12 not to call on a motion to end the clerk's appointment—on the
13 passing of the resolution; or
- 14 (c) if the Assembly does not pass a resolution mentioned in
15 subsection (4) within the 3 sitting days—at the end of the 3rd
16 sitting day.
- 17 (6) If the clerk is absent from duty, except on leave granted by the
18 Speaker, for 14 consecutive days or for 28 days in any 12-month
19 period, the Speaker may end the clerk's appointment.
- 20 (7) The clerk may only be suspended from duty under this section.
- 21 *Note* A person's appointment also ends if the person resigns (see Legislation
22 Act, s 210).
- 23 (8) The clerk is entitled to be paid salary and allowances while
24 suspended.
- 25 (9) The clerk's appointment may only be ended under this section or
26 section 51.

4 (1) The Speaker may retire the clerk on the ground of physical or
5 mental incapacity.

8 **53 Acting appointment as clerk**

9 The Speaker may appoint the deputy clerk, or in the absence of the
10 deputy clerk any other member of the staff of the secretariat, to act
11 as the clerk.

12 *Note* For the making of acting appointments, see the Legislation Act,
13 div 19.3.2.

14 **53A Legislative Assembly secretariat**

15 The Legislative Assembly secretariat consists of—

- 16 (a) the clerk; and
17 (b) the staff under section 54.
