An Act to amend the Pest Plants and Animals Act 2005

The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

12	(1)	A person commits an offence if—	
13		(a) the person imports something into the ACT; and

15		(i) a prohibited pest plant; or	
16		(ii) contaminated by a prohibited pest plant; and	
17		(c) the person is reckless about whether the thing imported is—	
18		(i) a prohibited pest plant; or	
19		(ii) contaminated by a prohibited pest plant; and	
20 21 22		(d) is reckless about whether the importation would result or would be likely to result in the spread of prohibited pest plants of that kind.	
23		Maximum penalty: 50 penalty units.
