An Act to amend the Legislative Assembly (Members' Staff) Act 1989

The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

		This Act is the Legislative Assembly (Members' Staff) Amendment Act 2008.
2		Commencement
	(1)	The following provisions commence on the day after the day the result of the 2008 general election of members of the Assembly is declared:  • section 3;  • section 5;  • section 7;  • section 8;  • section 9.  The remaining provisions commence on the first sitting day after the day the result of the 2008 general election of members of the Assembly is declared.  Note  The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on the notification day (see Legislation Act, s 75 (1)).
