## **Revenue Legislation Amendment Bill 2008 (No 2)**

### **A Bill for**

An Act to amend the *Duties Act 1999* and the *First Home Owner Grant Act 2000*

1 **Part 1 Preliminary**

2 **1 Name of Act**

3 This Act is the *Revenue Legislation Amendment Act 2008 (No 2)*.

4 **2 Commencement**

5 This Act commences on the day after its notification day.

6 *Note* The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on  
7 the notification day (see Legislation Act, s 75 (1)).

3 This part amends the *Duties Act 1999*.

8 **Example**

9 Emmy applies to register her car in the ACT. The car is registered in Emmy's  
10 name in Queensland. Under Queensland law, registration of Emmy's car is  
11 exempt from duty. However, under this Act, registration of Emmy's car is not  
12 exempt from duty. Section 218 does not apply, as Emmy has not paid duty in  
13 Queensland.

14 *Note* An example is part of the Act, is not exhaustive and may extend, but  
15 does not limit, the meaning of the provision in which it appears (see  
16 Legislation Act, s 126 and s 132).

**46A Meaning of *third-party debtor***

A *third-party debtor*, for a grant recipient, means 1 or more of the following people:

- (a) a person from whom any money is due or accruing, or may become due, to the grant recipient;
- (b) a person who holds, or may subsequently hold, money for or on account of the grant recipient;

- 1 (c) a person who holds, or may subsequently hold, money for or  
2 on account of someone else for payment to the grant recipient;
- 3 (d) a person who has authority from someone else to pay money to  
4 the grant recipient.

5 **12 Interest in relation to repayments**

**49A Power to recover amounts from third-party debtors**

(1) The commissioner may require a third-party debtor for a grant recipient to pay a recoverable amount instead of the grant recipient.

(2) The requirement must be made by written notice (a *recovery notice*) given to the third-party debtor.

*Note* For how documents may be given, see s 53 (1) (c).

(3) The recovery notice must—

(a) state the date of the notice; and

(b) state the recoverable amount; and

(c) include a statement about the effect of section 49B (1); and

(d) if section 49B (2) applies—include a statement about the effect of the section, and the amount required to be paid out of each instalment; and

(e) include a statement about the effect of section 49B (3).

(4) The recovery notice may also state a day by which the amount required to be paid under the recovery notice is payable.

(5) The commissioner must give a copy of the recovery notice to the grant recipient.

- 1     **49B       Payment of recoverable amounts by third-party debtors**
- 2             (1) The amount that a third-party debtor for a grant recipient is required
- 3               to pay under a recovery notice is—
- 4               (a) if the amount payable by the third-party debtor to the grant
- 5               recipient is equal to or less than the recoverable amount—all of
- 6               the amount payable; or
- 7               (b) if the amount payable by the third-party debtor to the grant
- 8               recipient is more than the recoverable amount—the
- 9               recoverable amount.
- 10            (2) If the amount payable by the third-party debtor to the grant recipient
- 11            is payable in instalments, the commissioner may require the debtor
- 12            to pay the commissioner an amount out of each instalment.
- 13            (3) A third-party debtor must pay the commissioner the amount
- 14            required to be paid under a recovery notice by the later of the
- 15            following:
- 16               (a) receipt of the recovery notice;
- 17               (b) when the amount held by the third-party debtor becomes due to
- 18               the grant recipient;
- 19               (c) the day (if any) stated by the commissioner in the recovery
- 20               notice.
- 21     **49C       Payment of recoverable amounts by others**
- 22             (1) This section applies if—
- 23               (a) the commissioner gives a recovery notice to a third-party
- 24               debtor for a grant recipient; and
- 25               (b) someone else pays all or part of the recoverable amount to the
- 26               commissioner after the notice is given.

- 1 (2) If the other person pays all of the recoverable amount, the  
2 commissioner must—
- 3 (a) tell the third-party debtor that the debtor is not liable to pay the  
4 recoverable amount; and
- 5 (b) if the third-party debtor makes a payment towards the  
6 recoverable amount after the other person pays all of the  
7 amount—repay the third-party debtor the payment.
- 8 (3) If the other person pays part of the recoverable amount, the  
9 commissioner must give the third-party debtor another notice  
10 (a *revised recovery notice*) stating the new amount that the debtor is  
11 required to pay.

12 **49D Offence—third-party debtors to comply with notices**

- 13 (1) A third-party debtor for a grant recipient must comply with—
- 14 (a) a recovery notice; or
- 15 (b) if a revised recovery notice is given to the debtor—the revised  
16 recovery notice.

17 Maximum penalty: 50 penalty units.

- 18 (2) If a third-party debtor is convicted of an offence against  
19 subsection (1), the court may, in addition to imposing a penalty on  
20 the debtor, order the debtor to pay the commissioner an amount that  
21 is not more than the recoverable amount under the recovery notice  
22 or revised recovery notice to which the offence relates.
- 23 (3) In this section:
- 24 *revised recovery notice*—see section 49C (3).

1 **49E Third-party debtors indemnified**

2 A third-party debtor for a grant recipient who makes a payment  
3 under this part is—

- 4 (a) taken to be acting under the authority of the grant recipient and  
5 anyone else concerned; and  
6 (b) indemnified by this section in relation to the payment.

7 **Part 5 Miscellaneous**8 **17 Secrecy**  
9 **Section 50 (1), definition of *protected information***

10 *substitute*

11 *protected information* means information about the following  
12 people that is disclosed to, or obtained by, a person to whom this  
13 section applies in the course of work related to the administration of  
14 this Act:

- 15 (a) a grant recipient;  
16 (b) a third-party debtor for a grant recipient.

17 **18 Dictionary, new definitions**

19 *grant recipient* means—

- 20 (a) an applicant (or former applicant) for a first home owner grant  
21 to whom an amount is paid under this Act; or  
22 (b) any other person to whom an amount is paid under this Act.

23 *objector*, for division 2.6 (Objections and appeals)—see  
24 section 24A.

- 1            *recoverable amount*, for part 4 (Repayment and recovery of  
2            grant)—see section 49 (1).
- 3            *recovery notice*, for part 4 (Repayment and recovery of grant)—see  
4            section 49A (2).
- 5            *third-party debtor*, for a grant recipient—see section 46A.
