2		The CYP death review committee has the following functions:
3		(a) to keep a register of deaths of children and young people under part 19A.3;
5 6		(b) to identify patterns and trends in relation to the deaths of children and young people;
7 8		(c) to undertake research that aims to help prevent or reduce the likelihood of the death of children and young people;
9 10 11		(d) to identify areas requiring further research by the committee or another entity in relation to the deaths of children and young people;
12 13 14 15		(e) to make recommendations about legislation, policies, practices and services for implementation by the Territory and non-government bodies to help prevent or reduce the likelihood of the death of children and young people;
16 17		(f) to monitor the implementation of the committee's recommendations;
18		(g) to report to the Minister under part 19A.4;
19		(h) any other function given to the committee under this chapter.
20	727C	Committee members
21		The CYP death review committee is made up of—
22		(a) the chief executive; and
23		(b) the children and young people commissioner; and
24 25		(c) the members appointed by the Minister under section 727D; and
26		(d) the chair appointed under section 727E.

2	(1)		Minister must appoint 1 of each of the following as a member e CYP death review committee:
4 5 6 7		(a)	a psychologist who is registered under the <i>Health Practitioner Regulation National Law (ACT) Act 2010</i> to practice psychology, and has experience in child health and development;
8		(b)	a paediatrician with experience in child forensic medicine;
9		(c)	a health practitioner with experience in working with children and young people and families in a community setting;
1		(d)	someone with expertise and experience in designing and modifying products and systems in relation to safety;

20 21 22 23	(1)	The chief executive must, on request of the CYP death review committee, make arrangements with the committee to use public servants in the administrative unit under the chief executive's control.
24 25 26 27 28		Note The chief executive means the chief executive of the administrative unit responsible for this section (see Legislation Act, s 163 (References to a chief executive or the chief executive)). Administrative units are established under the administrative arrangements (see <i>Public Sector Management Act 1994</i> , s 13).

1 (2) The *Public Sector Management Act 1994* applies to the management 2 by the committee of public servants who are the subject of an arrangement under subsection (1).

4 Part 19A.2 Meetings of committee

5 727H Meetings

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- (1) The CYP death review committee must meet at least 4 times each year.
 - (2) The chair must give the committee at least 14 days written notice of a meeting.

10 727I Presiding member at meetings

The chair presides at all meetings of the CYP death review committee.

13 727J Quorum at meetings

- (1) Business may be carried on at a meeting of the CYP death review committee only if at least ¾ of the members (other than the chair) are present.
- (2) A member must not be represented at a meeting by anyone else.

18 **727K** Voting at meetings

- (1) At a meeting of the CYP death review committee, each member, other than the chair, has a vote on each question to be decided.
- 21 (2) A question is decided by a majority of the votes of the members present and voting.
