# Gaming Machine (Problem Gambling Assistance) Amendment Bill 2010

# A Bill for

An Act to amend the Gaming Machine Act 2004

The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

1	Name of Act
	This Act is the Gaming Machine (Problem Gambling Assistance) Amendment Act 2010.
2	Commencement
(1)	This Act (other than section 5) commences on 1 January 2011.
	Note The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on the notification day (see Legislation Act, s 75 (1)).
(2)	Section 5 commences on 1 July 2011.

	This Act amends the Gaming Machine Act 2004.

Division	11.2 Problem gambling assistance fund
163A	Required payment to problem gambling assistance fund
(1)	A licensee is liable to pay the required percentage of the licensee's gross revenue for each month to the problem gambling assistance fund.
(2)	The <i>required percentage</i> is 0.375%.
(3)	The amount required to be paid for a month is payable on the
	7th day after the end of the month.

2	(1)	The commission must open and maintain a banking account (the <i>problem gambling assistance fund</i> ).
4 5	(2)	A payment out of the fund may be made only for a purpose the commission is satisfied will assist in—
6		(a) alleviating problem gambling; or
7 8		(b) alleviating the disadvantages that arise from problem gambling; or
9		(c) providing or ascertaining information about problem gambling.

7		(b) who paid the amounts;
8		(c) the amounts that were paid out of the fund during the year;
9		(d) who the amounts were paid to;
0		(e) the purposes for which the amounts were paid.

3	(2)	The required percentage is—
4		(a) 0.75%; or
5 6		(b) if the Minister determines a different percentage under subsection (2A)—that percentage.
