		This Act commences on the day after its notification day.

2 3	(1)	The director-general must prepare a transition plan for a young person who is—
4		(a) in out-of-home care; and
5		(b) at least 15 years old.
6 7	(2)	The director-general must take reasonable steps to ensure that the transition plan is implemented.
8	529E	Transition plans—consultation
9 10	(1)	This section applies if the director-general is preparing a transition plan for a young person.
11 12	(2)	The director-general must develop the plan in consultation with the young person.
13 14 15	(3)	The director-general may also consult 1 or more of the following people about the proposals the director-general intends to include in the transition plan:
16 17		(a) for a young person in out-of-home care—the out-of-home carer;

13		(a) the young person; and
14		(b) if the young person agrees—
15 16		(i) anyone who would be involved in implementing a proposal in the plan; and
