# Private adoption agencies not to breach Territory privacy principles

 A private adoption agency commits an offence if it does something that would, if it were a public sector agency for the *Information Privacy Act 2014*, breach a Territory privacy principle within the meaning of that Act.

Maximum penalty: 5 penalty units.

- *Note* The Territory privacy principles (the *TPPs*) are contained in the *Information Privacy Act 2014*, sch 1. The TPPs deal with the following issues:
  - (a) open and transparent management of personal information;
- (b) anonymity and pseudonymity;
  - (c) collection of solicited personal information;
