An Act to amend the *Corrections Management Act 2007*, and for other purposes

The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

2			This Act is the Corrections Management Amendment Act 2015.

4 5		(1)	Sections 6 and 8 commence on the day after this Act's notification day.
