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## **Lifetime Care and Support (Catastrophic Injuries) Amendment Bill 2016 (No 2)**

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### **A Bill for**

An Act to amend the *Lifetime Care and Support (Catastrophic Injuries) Act 2014*, and for other purposes

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The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

1 **1 Name of Act**

2 This Act is the *Lifetime Care and Support (Catastrophic Injuries)*  
3 *Amendment Act 2016 (No 2)*.

4 **2 Commencement**

5 This Act commences immediately after the commencement of the  
6 *Lifetime Care and Support (Catastrophic Injuries) Amendment*  
7 *Act 2016*, section 3.

8 *Note* The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on  
9 the notification day (see [Legislation Act](#), s 75 (1)).

10 **3 Legislation amended**

11 This Act amends the *Lifetime Care and Support (Catastrophic*  
12 *Injuries) Act 2014*.

13 *Note* This Act also amends the following legislation (see sch 1):

- 14 • *Road Transport (Third-Party Insurance) Act 2008*
- 15 • *Workers Compensation Act 1951*.

16 **4 Application of Act**

**6 Payment of participants assessed treatment and care needs**  
**Section 30 (3) (b)**

(b) by giving the participant an amount to cover the expenses over a stated period under—

(i) a payment agreement with the participant; or

(ii) a periodic payment agreement with the participant under section 30A; or

(iii) a lump sum agreement with the participant under section 30B (Lump sum payment—foreign national participant).

**7 New sections 30A and 30B**

**30A Periodic payment—overseas participant**

- (1) The LTCS commissioner and an overseas participant may agree that the commissioner pay the participant's expenses under section 30 by giving the participant periodic payments to cover the participant's expenses while living outside Australia (a *periodic payment agreement*).

- 1           (2) The overseas participant's expenses payable under section 30 must  
2           be paid under that section until the participant enters into the  
3           periodic payment agreement.
- 4           (3) If the overseas participant returns to Australia to live before the end  
5           of the periodic payment agreement—
- 6               (a) the periodic payment agreement ceases to have effect; and  
7               (b) section 30 (3) applies in relation to the payment of expenses in  
8               relation to the participant's treatment and care needs; and  
9               (c) any amount paid for the period remaining on the agreement  
10              after it ceases to have effect must be repaid to the LTCS  
11              commissioner.
- 12          (4) The LTCS guidelines may make provision for determining the  
13          following:
- 14               (a) the period an overseas participant must live outside Australia  
15               to be eligible to enter into a periodic payment agreement;  
16               (b) the total amount and frequency of periodic payments to an  
17               overseas participant under a periodic payment agreement;  
18               (c) the calculation of the amount to be repaid under  
19               subsection (3) (c).
- 20          *Note*     The LTCS guidelines are made under s 93.
- 21          (5) In this section:
- 22               ***overseas participant*** means a participant in the LTCS scheme  
23               who—
- 24               (a) is an Australian citizen or a permanent resident of Australia;  
25               and  
26               (b) lives outside Australia; and  
27               (c) intends to live outside Australia permanently or for an  
28               extended time.

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1     **30B       Lump sum payment—foreign national participant**

- 2           (1) The LTCS commissioner and a foreign national participant may  
3           agree that the commissioner pay the participant's expenses under  
4           section 30 (Payment of participants assessed treatment and care  
5           needs) by giving the participant a lump sum payment to cover the  
6           participant's expenses (a *lump sum agreement*).
- 7           (2) The foreign national participant's expenses payable under section 30  
8           must be paid under that section until the participant enters into the  
9           lump sum agreement.
- 10          (3) The LTCS guidelines may make provision for determining the  
11          following:
- 12               (a) the period a foreign national participant must live outside  
13               Australia to be eligible to enter into a lump sum agreement;
- 14               (b) the amount of a lump sum payable to a foreign national  
15               participant under a lump sum agreement.
- 16          *Note*     The LTCS guidelines are made under s 93.
- 17          (4) If a foreign national participant receives a lump sum under a lump  
18          sum agreement with the LTCS commissioner, the foreign national  
19          participant—
- 20               (a) ceases to be a participant in the LTCS scheme; and
- 21               (b) is not eligible for compensation in relation to the participant's  
22               treatment and care needs under—
- 23                       (i) for a motor accident injury—the [CTP Act](#); or
- 24                       (ii) for a work injury—the [Workers Compensation Act 1951](#).

1 (5) In this section:

2 *foreign national participant* means a lifetime participant in the  
3 LTCS scheme who—

4 (a) is a national of a foreign country; and

5 (b) lives outside Australia.

6 **8 Appropriation of certain amounts for LTCS fund**

**83A Determination of amount to be contributed to LTCS fund—motor accidents involving ACT government-owned vehicles**

- (1) This section applies if—
- (a) a person is catastrophically injured in a motor accident involving a motor vehicle owned by the Territory, or a territory authority, at the time of the accident; and
  - (b) a CTP policy was not in force for the motor vehicle at the time of the motor accident; and
  - (c) as a consequence of the injuries suffered in the motor accident, the person becomes a participant in the LTCS scheme.
- (2) The LTCS commissioner must determine, in writing, the amount ACTIA needs to contribute (the *required fund contribution*)—
- (a) to fully fund the present and likely future liabilities of the LTCS commissioner under part 6 (Payments under LTCS scheme) in relation to the injuries suffered by the person; and
  - (b) to meet the payments needed to be made from the fund (other than payments under part 6) in relation to the person; and
  - (c) to provide for any other matters the LTCS commissioner should, in all the circumstances, prudently make provision for in relation to liabilities under part 6.

*Note 1* Power to make the determination includes power to make different provision in relation to different matters or different classes of matters, and to make a determination that applies differently by reference to stated exceptions or factors (see [Legislation Act](#), s 48).

1                   *Note 2*   The power to make an instrument includes the power to amend or repeal  
2                                    the instrument (see [Legislation Act](#), s 46).

- 4           (3) The amount needed to fully fund the present and likely future  
5           liability of the LTCS commissioner under part 6 in relation to the  
6           injuries suffered by the person is an amount sufficient to provide an  
7           amount of money that together with anticipated investment income  
8           is equal to the best estimate of the cost of meeting the liability (in  
9           inflated dollars) when the liability comes payable.
- 10          (4) The LTCS commissioner's determination of the required fund  
11          contribution for the injuries suffered by the person must be made in  
12          accordance with—
- 13              (a) the report of an independent actuary; and
  - 14              (b) if the motor accident involved more than 1 motor vehicle—the  
15              commissioner's apportionment of liability attributed to the  
16              motor vehicle owned by the Territory or territory authority;  
17              and
  - 18              (c) the LTCS guidelines for determining the required fund  
19              contribution.

20           *Note*       The LTCS guidelines are made under s 93.

21       **83B           Contributions to fund by ACTIA**

- 22          (1) ACTIA must make the required fund contribution determined for a  
23          person under section 83A by lump sum payment to the LTCS  
24          commissioner.

25           *Note*       **ACTIA**—see the dictionary.

- 26          (2) If the person is not accepted as a lifetime participant in the LTCS  
27          scheme, the LTCS commissioner must refund to ACTIA the part of  
28          the lump sum paid under subsection (1) that is not needed as a result  
29          of the person not being accepted as a lifetime participant.

- 1           (3) The LTCS guidelines may make provision for the following:
- 2           (a) the resolution of disputes between ACTIA and the LTCS
- 3           commissioner about the amount to be paid under
- 4           subsection (1);
- 5           (b) the calculation of the amount to be refunded under
- 6           subsection (2);
- 7           (c) the application of interest received on the investment of lump
- 8           sums received under this section, including in relation to fees
- 9           that may be charged, or deductions that may be made, for
- 10          making or managing the investment of a lump sum.

22 (i) arose while the person was a participant in the LTCS  
23 scheme; or

- 1 (ii) arise after the person receives the lump sum under the  
2 lump sum agreement.

- 6 (3) This section applies—
- 7 (a) whether or not the treatment and care needs are assessed

- 9 (b) whether or not the LTCS commissioner is required to make a  
10 payment in relation to the treatment and care needs; and
- 11 (c) whether or not the treatment, care, support or services provided  
12 in connection with the treatment and care needs is provided  
13 without charge on a gratuitous basis.

(2A) Despite subsection (1) (a), (b) and (c), the employer is not liable to pay the costs of any treatment and care needs, or excluded treatment and care, of the worker—

(a) if the worker is a participant in the LTCS scheme—

(i) that relate to the injury for which the worker is a participant in the scheme; and

(ii) that arise while the worker is a participant in the scheme;  
or

(b) if the worker receives a lump sum under a lump sum agreement with the LTCS commissioner in relation to the injury for which the worker was a participant in the scheme—

(i) that relate to the injury; and

(ii) either—

(A) arose while the worker was a participant in the LTCS scheme; or

(B) arise after the worker receives the lump sum under the lump sum agreement.
