An Act to amend the *Emergencies Act 2004*, and for other purposes

The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

his Act is the Emergencies Amendment Act 2020. ommencement his Act commences on the day after its notification day. 	(b) if the emergency controller for the emergency is unavailable or is, for any other reason, unable to perform the functions of the emergency controller during the emergency—to act as the emergency controller.
	Note A person acting in a position under a standing acting arrangement has all the functions (including authorities, duties and powers) of the occupant of the position (in this case, the emergency controller)—see the Legislation Act, s 225B.
