A Bill for

An Act to amend legislation about electricity safety, and for other purposes

The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

1 **Part 1 Preliminary**

2 **1 Name of Act**

3 This Act is the *Electricity Safety Legislation Amendment Act 2022*.

4 **2 Commencement**

5 This Act commences on the day after its notification day.

6 *Note* The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on
7 the notification day (see [Legislation Act](#), s 75 (1)).

8 **3 Legislation amended**

9 This Act amends the *Construction Occupations (Licensing) Act 2004*
10 and the *Electricity Safety Act 1971*.

11 *Note* The *Electricity Safety Act 1971* is also amended in sch 1.

6 Minister is reasonably satisfied that—

7 (a) the regulated utility is adequately regulated under another
8 territory or Commonwealth law; and

9 (b) the exemption does not increase the risk to public safety.

10 *Note* Power to make an exemption includes power to make different provision
11 in relation to different matters or different classes of matters, and to make
12 an instrument that applies by reference to stated exceptions or factors (see
13 [Legislation Act](#), s 48).

14 (2) An exemption is a disallowable instrument.
