Births, Deaths and Marriages Registration Amendment Bill 2023

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A Bill for

An Act to amend the *Births, Deaths and Marriages Registration Act 1997* and the *Births, Deaths and Marriages Registration Regulation 1998*

The Legislative Assembly for the Australian Capital Territory enacts as follows:

Part 1 Preliminary

Name of Act This Act is the Births, Deaths and Marriages Registration 3 4 Amendment Act 2023. 5 Commencement (1) This Act (other than sections 4 to 7 and 20) commences on the day 6 after its notification day. 7 Note The naming and commencement provisions automatically commence on 8 the notification day (see Legislation Act, s 75 (1)). 9 10 (2) Sections 4 to 7 and 20 commence on a day fixed by the Minister by written notice. 11 A single day or time may be fixed, or different days or times may be Note 12 fixed, for the commencement of different provisions (see Legislation Act, 13 s 77 (1)). 14 (3) If sections 4 to 7 and 20 have not commenced within 12 months beginning on this Act's notification day, they automatically 16 commence on the first day after that period. 17 (4) The Legislation Act, section 79 (Automatic commencement of 18 postponed law) does not apply to sections 4 to 7 and 20. 19
