2		This Act is the Civil Law (Wrongs) (Thresholds) Amendment Act 2003.

5		This Act commences on the day after its notification day.

99B Review of operation of s 99A

- The Minister must review the operation of section 99A as soon as practicable after the second anniversary of the commencement of that section.
- 6 (2) The Minister must present to the Legislative Assembly the report of the review within 6 months after the review begins.

- 22 (3) Subsection (1) is declared to be a law to which the Legislation Act, 23 section 88 (Repeal does not end effect of transitional laws etc) 24 applies.
