DIVISION OF GORDON: THEME SPORTSMEN AND WOMEN

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE/REMARKS
O'HARA CLOSE	Hector (Pat) O'Hara (1891-1961)	Tennis player; born St Kilda Melbourne. He was an international tennis player. The highlights of his career included the Wimbledon Doubles title. The Australian singles championships in 1920 and 1923 and the Australian Doubles in 1919-20, 1923 and 1925. He represented Australia in the Davis Cup teams of 1920, 1922 and 1924. A smooth Easternstyle player he was considered a model of unaffected orthodoxy and correct footwork.

McKIVAT CLOSE

(1879-1941)

Christopher McKivat Footballer; born Burrawang, New South Wales. He led the Wallabies seventeen times, including the match against Cornwell at the London Olympic Games in 1908 when Australia won gold medals. He switched to Rugby League and in 1910 played in all three Tests against Britain. In 1911-12 he led the Kangaroos in a successful tour of the UK.

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE/REMARKS
MINNETT CLOSE	Roy Minnett (1888-1955)	Cricketer; a fine right-handed batsman and an excellent fast-medium bowler, he was one of three brothers who played for the State. He played in nine Tests and ten Sheffield Shield matches. During his first class career he scored 2,203 runs and took 86 wickets.
COVENTRY CLOSE	Gordon Coventry (1901-1986)	Footballer; over a 17-year span with the Collingwood Club he kicked 1299 goals, 4 times breaking the century for a season (1929,124 goals, 1930,118 goals, 1933,108 goals, and 1934,105 goals). He landed 100 goals for Victoria in 25 interstate matches. His career with Collingwood covered 1920-37.
REVELL CLOSE	Ray Revell (1912-1967)	Racing car driver; he began his racing career in Sydney 1934. Australian Champion 1947, 1950-53. He was the winner of the Sydney and Brisbane World Championships in 1948, 1950 and 1952.

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE/REMARKS
ROBIN PLACE	Douglas Robin (1921-1979)	Cricketer; he moved to Canberra in 1940 and became a leading figure in A.C.T. Cricket. He held the A.C.T. bowling record with ten wickets in an innings. He was Secretary of the A.C.T. Cricket Association for five years and Vice-President for four years.
SCARFE CLOSE	Warren Scarfe (1936-1964)	Champion Cyclist; a Commonwealth Games silver

Commonwealth Games silver medallist a dual Olympian and holder of four Australian track records. An enthusiastic member of the St George club, he won the club title in 1956-57 and repeated this effort for the next five years while he won the club road championship and a NSW 1000 metres time trial title.

He won 24 state titles and 2 national titles. He represented Australia at the Melbourne 1956 and Rome 1960 Olympics, missing a bronze medal by only 0.5 secs in the time trial and setting 4 Australian track records.




