

DIVISION OF NGUNNAWAL: NOTABLE ABORIGINALS AND WORDS

NAMES	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
PAUL COE CRESCENT	Paul Joseph Coe (1900-1979)	Aboriginal businessman, Rodeo star and Political activist. Born Cowra, NSW. At the age of eighteen he began droving with his father throughout NSW and QLD. He established his own droving business at the age of thirty which he successfully ran for many years. He was also known throughout NSW as a star buckjumper on the rodeo circuit. He played football and coached several "all black" teams and was involved in the push for equal rights for Aborigines. He was the grandfather of Aboriginal Lawyer Paul Coe.
NOONGALE PLACE	Billy Noongale (1852-1904)	Aboriginal Explorer. Born in the Beverley District of Western Australia. He accompanied Sir John Forrest's expedition from Perth to Adelaide in 1870 and into the interior of Western Australia in 1874. When he died Sir John Forrest erected a tombstone in his memory.

NAMES	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
LANLEY SQUARE	Larry Lanley (1927-1981)	Aborigine. Born Mornington Island, Queensland. He was the Chairman of the Aboriginal Arts Board of the Australian Council, he played a major role in asserting Aboriginal Culture. He was a member of the Federal Government's advisory body, the Council for Aboriginal Development and a Director of the Australian Aborigines, Woomera, an association devoted to the teaching of Aboriginal art, dancing and culture particularly in schools.
KUDYERA PLACE		A Ngunnawal word meaning "fighting club".
GUDAMANG CLOSE		A Ngunnawal word meaning "turtle".
MULLEUN CLOSE		A Ngunnawal word meaning "eagle".

DIVISION OF NGUNNAWAL: NOTABLE ABORIGINALS AND WORDS

NAMES	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
BIGGS STREET	Frederick Biggs (c.1875-1961)	Aboriginal storyteller and singer. Born near Ivanhoe, NSW. He was raised in the territory of the Ngiyamba Aborigines and lived a near traditional lifestyle. He was initiated at the age of fourteen. He later worked in the pastoral industry. He passed on parts of traditional lore to researchers such as 'Ronald Berndt', who he helped with the book "Clever Men". Some of his songs and stories were published in the book "Aboriginal Myths and Legends" by Roland Robinson.
RILEY CLOSE	Alex Riley (1884-1970)	Aboriginal Tracker. Famed as "Tracker Riley", he lived at Talbragar, near Dubbo, and served in the police force from 1918-43. He captured the murderer of the Moss family in the 1930s and received the King's Medal for distinguished police service in 1943. He was given a state funeral at Dubbo.

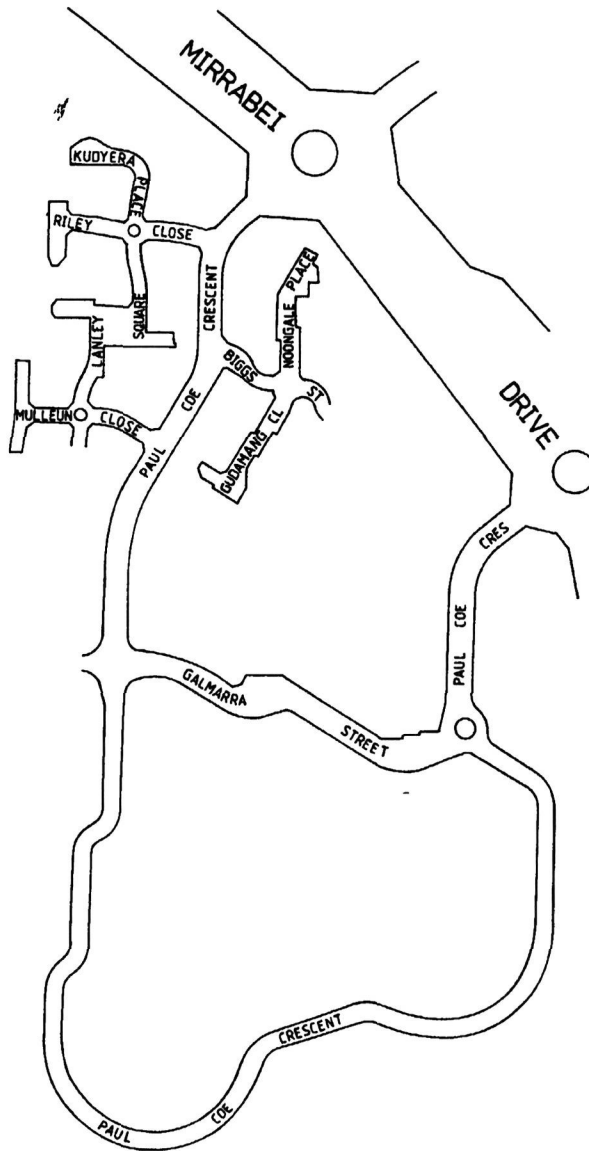

NAMES	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
GALMARRA STREET	"Jackey Jackey" (Galmarra) (d.1854)	Aboriginal Explorer. He was a member of the Muswellbrook tribe. In 1848 he accompanied Kennedy on his expedition to the tip of Cape York. The explorers endured great hardship and Galmarra proved himself to be one of the best men in the expedition.
