DIVISION OF AMAROO: AUSTRALIAN RIVERS AND LAKES

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
TYENNA CLOSE		A Tasmanian River. Tyenna River is a western tributary of the Derwent River. Part of it forms the extreme eastern boundary of Mt Field National Park. Tyenna is an aboriginal word meaning 'bandicoot'.
CORRINGLE CLOSE		A Victorian Lake. A saltwater lake near Orbost.
PHELP COURT		A Northern Territory River. A tributary of the Roper River in south eastern Arnhem Land, which flows into the Gulf of Carpentaria. It is north east of the Ngukurr Community and is believed to bear the name of John Phelp Robinson of Sydney, after Ludwig Lichhardt also named the Robinson River in 1884.


