

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
McClelland Avenue	William McClelland (1875-1957)	Born in Buninyong, Victoria. He was a brilliant centre half back for the Melbourne Football Club and Captain from 1901-04. He was President of the Victorian Football League from 1926-55 and of the Melbourne Cricket Ground from 1944 -57.
Fleetwood-Smith Crescent	Leslie Fleetwood-Smith (1910-1971)	Cricketer. He was a left-handed spin bowler and took 597 wickets in 123 first class matches. He remained an Australian bowler from 1935-38 and in 7 tests took 33 English wickets. His most famous feat occurred in 1936 at the Melbourne Cricket Ground when he took 7 wickets for 17 runs against England off 80 balls.



NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Clemenger Crescent	John Clemenger OBE (1899-1964)	Tennis Player. Born in Gundaroo, NSW. He was Captain and Manager of the Davis Cup Tennis Team in 1932 and selector for 8 years. He was the Victorian President of the Lawn Tennis Association of Australia in 1936.
Curran Drive	George Curran (1852-1918)	A Pioneer in the Gungahlin area. He was the blacksmith at Ginninderra from 1874-89, when he moved to Bungendore. He married Mary Ann Hatch and raised a family of nine children. He was active in sporting and community affairs. His nephew Henry Roland Curran later became the Ginninderra blacksmith, a trade he carried on for many years in the old blacksmith's shop which still stands.

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Moriarty Street	Daniel Moriarty (1895-1982)	Sportsman and Racing Writer. He played his first SA National Football League match for South Adelaide in 1919 and won the Margarey Medal in three successive years from 1919-21, a feat not yet repeated. He retired in 1926 and began writing for the "Southern Cross" as a special racing writer and then became a reporter for the "Adelaide News" . He was also an owner of champion race horses.

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Fitzsimmons Street	Robert Fitzsimmons (1863-1917)	Born in Cornwall, England. He first boxed at the age of 15 in New Zealand. In 1880 he knocked out four opponents in one afternoon at Timaru. Between 1883-90 he lived in Sydney and won 16 of his 27 bouts. In 1890 he migrated to the USA. In 1891 he knocked out Jack Dempsey and won the Middleweight Championship. In 1897 he knocked out "Gentleman Jim" Corbett to win the Heavyweight Championship of the World. He lost the title two years later, but won the World Light Heavyweight Championship in 1905. He boxed until the age of 50 and won 53 of his 81 professional bouts.



NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Kleinig Street	Frank Kleinig (1908-1976)	A Champion Car Racing Driver. Born in Sydney he achieved tremendous success in the late 1930s and into the 1940s. He won the 1937 and 38 Wakefield Trophies and the 1939 and 1948 Australian Hillclimb Titles. He set a new Sydney-Melbourne record of 8 hours and 15 minutes in 1941.
Gordon Close	Graham Gordon OAM (1928-1993)	Rugby Union player. Although his consuming passion was Rugby Union for over 40 years. He also co-formed the Queanbeyan Ju-Jitsu and Karate Club, in 1962 and was a member of the Lions Club of Queanbeyan from 1965-78. In that time he served various terms as Director, Secretary and President. He also served as Secretary from 1958-64 and as President from 1967-83 of the Queanbeyan Rugby Union Football Club.



NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Beal Place	James Charles Beal (1830-1904)	Sportsman. He was educated at St James Grammar School, Sydney, NSW. He played cricket for NSW and was a champion rower. He was Commodore of the City of Brisbane Sailing Club for 3 years and President of various football clubs and a committee member of the Qld Turf Club.
Minter Place	Alexander Robert Minter (1854-1929)	Born in Windsor NSW. He captained the Wallaroos and Burwood Rugby Union Teams. He was a distinguished oarsman and golfer.
Seaborn Place	Leslie Watson Saunderson Seaborn (1877-1931)	Born in Young NSW. He represented NSW in Rugby Union in 1907. He was a committee member and Vice President of Rugby Union and organiser of the Sportsman Battalion in 1915 and Manager of the Australian Imperial Force Rugby Union Team.

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Waine Place	John Charles Waine (c.1851-1918)	Born in Oxfordshire, England. A cricketer and President of the South Sydney Cricket Club and the South Sydney Rugby Union Club. He was a bowls enthusiast and toured England with the NSW Team in 1912.
McShane Place	Patrick McShane (1857-1903)	A very fine left handed bowler and an excellent batsman. He played in three tests from 1884-88 and achieved good performances in interstate matches. During his first class career 1880-92 he scored 1,117 runs and took 72 wickets.
Donnan Street	Henry Donnan (1864-1956)	A right handed batsman he played in 32 Sheffield Shield matches and five Tests. During his first class career from 1887-1900 he scored 4,262 runs, including 6 centuries.



NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Phillis Place	Tom Phillis (1935-1962)	Motorcycle Champion. The winner of the World 125cc World Title in 1961. He won the Grand Prix at Phillip Island the same year and was killed in Europe early in the 1962, World Championship Season.
Hatch Place	George Hatch (1906-1988)	Sportsman. In his youth he played first grade soccer and for some time was on the judiciary of the ACT Soccer Association. He helped found the ACT Baseball Association for which he was President for many years. In 1965 he was elected President of the NSW Country Baseball Association. He was also keen on cricket and tennis and was a member of the Canberra South Bowling Club for 30 years.

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Ponsford Place	Bill Ponsford (1900-1991)	Test Cricketer. Played 29 Test matches and scored 2,122 runs including seven centuries at the Oval in 1934. He was claimed by contemporaries to be second only to Bradman.
Hutcheon Place	John Hutcheon (1882-1957)	A prominent Lawyer, he played cricket, tennis and lacrosse. He was president of the Qld Cricket Association for 30 years and was a member of the QLD Lacrosse Council during the 1920's. He was Chairman of the Australian Cricket Board of Control from 1924-25.

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Berwick Place	Henry (Harry) Williamson Berwick (1923-1988)	Golfer. The only Australian amateur ever invited to compete in the US Masters. The invitation came after he won the Lakes Open and the 1956 New Zealand Open. Born in Mascot, Sydney, he joined St Michaels Golf Club in 1947. He won the club championship 15 times and the St Michaels Cup eight times. He won the Prestigious St George Vase in 1954. His winning score of 141 remains the record. He turned professional in 1975 and remains the oldest top line Australian Player to do so. Behind him lay victories in the Killara Cup and the City of Sydney Open, two Long Reef medals, three Manly Cups, three Pennant Hills Cups, two Pymble Cups, the Oatlands Cup, the New Brighton Cup, the Boonie Doon medal and the NSW Vardon Trophy.

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Barclay Place	Grace Barclay (1888-1979) Lillias Barclay (1888-1973) Ethel Barclay (1892-1971)	Golfer's. All three sisters were born in Tasmania. They won the Tasmanian Women's foursome for the first six years it was held, from 1922-27 and also in 1929. Grace won two Tasmanian Women's Amateur Championships in 1919 and 1922. Lillias went on to win in 1923, 1927 and 1928, but foursome events were really her strength. She won four Tasmanian mixed foursome events, three in succession 1924,1925 and 1926 and again in 1935. Grace and Lillias were both foundation member's of the Tasmanian Ladies Golf Union, Grace serving as Secretary for fifty years and Lillias serving as Vice President and President for 26 years. They were also delegate's of the Australian Ladies Golf Union. They were all life members of both the Royal Hobart and Kingston Beach Clubs.

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Rumbelow Court	Eric Leslie Rumbelow (1898-1945)	Lifesaver and swimming coach. He was the holder of many swimming titles and the first South Australian to receive a Diploma from the Royal Lifesaving Society in 1926.
Ayers-Fowler Crescent	Florence Ayers-Fowler (1877-1966)	Golfer. Born in Adelaide, SA. She was the SA Australian Ladies Amateur Champion seven times between 1902 and 1922. She was the runner up of the Australian Ladies Championship in 1903 and 1912. She was the Italian Ladies Champion in 1931 at the age of 54 and runner up at Lausanne in the Swiss Championships in 1932. She represented SA at both tennis and golf.



NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Sainsbury Place	Mark Sainsbury (1968-1992)	Professional Surfer. He was a six year veteran of the World Tour and developed a manoeuvre called the "floater" in the mid 1980's. He perfected the technique in 1985, the year he won the world most prestigious junior contest, the Australian Pro Junior. He won the World Amateur Championships in Newquay England in 1986 and was a member of the Australian side which won the team championship. Following his success, he joined the World Professional Tour and recorded consistent results for the next six years. He won 2 Pro am Titles. The height of his career was his victory in the "XXXX Surf Classic "at the Gold Coast in 1989 in which he defeated World No 2 Gary Elkerton.



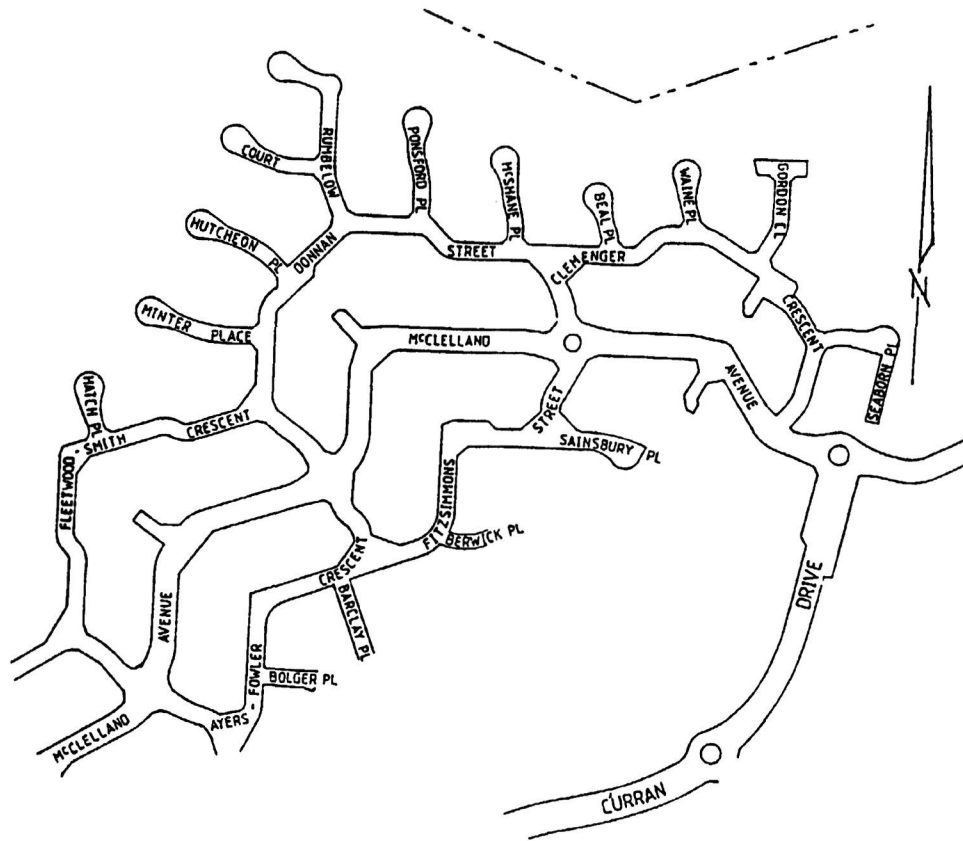

NAME	ORIGIN	SIGNIFICANCE
Bolger Place	(Billy) William Joseph Bolger (1910-1977)	Golfer. During his career he did everything from shooting a 60 at Sydney's rugged Oatlands Course in 1940 - helped along by an eagle and 8 birdies - to defeating the American superstar Gene Sarazen in the 1934 Australian Open and equalling the then World Record of 283 for a National Title. He won the NSW Professional Title in 1930 when he was only 20 years old and was runner up in the 1935 Australian Open. He won his second NSW Professional Title in 1938.

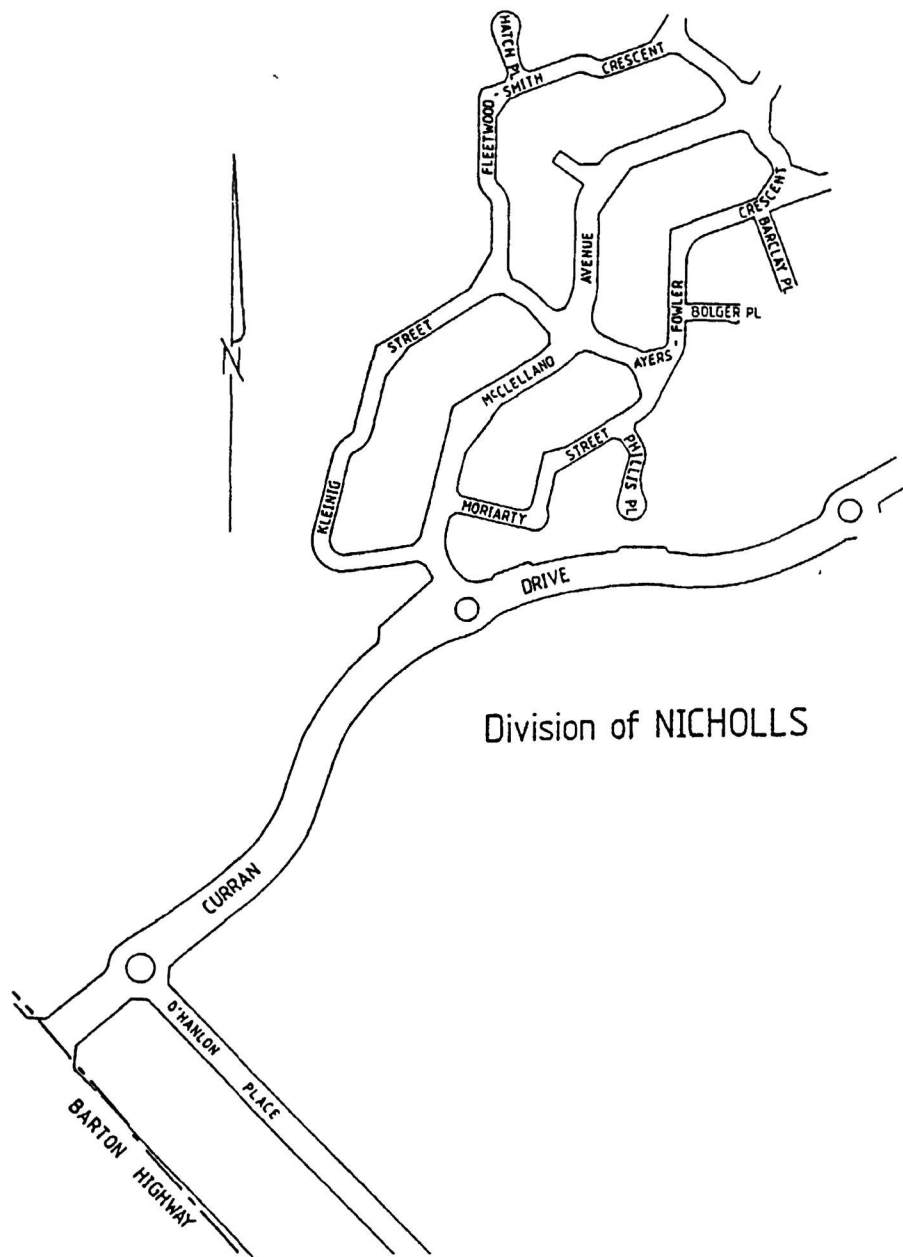
