

Karia Place		Nyungar word meaning "country" and "homeland"
Lanne Place	William Lanne (1829-1869)	Last known full-blooded Tasmanian male Aborigine
Newbu Place	Newbu (1900-1994)	One of Australia's greatest Aboriginal trackers
Tangari Street		A South Australian Aboriginal word meaning "edible gum"


