
Division of Gungahlin: Early Gungahlin District Pioneers, Homesteads and Sites

NAME Gungahlin Place	ORIGIN Gungahlin Homestead	SIGNIFICANCE 'Gungahlin' homestead was built by William David in 1862, sold to Edward Grace in 1877 remaining in the family until the Commonwealth took over the land as part of the Federal Capital Territory.
Crinigan Circle	John Crinigan (1817-1899)	Gungahlin District Pioneer - Settled in the 'Tea Gardens' area in the 1850's
Ginn Street	William Ginn (1822-1904)	Gungahlin District Pioneer - Blundell's Cottage was built for William Ginn in 1866 he lived there until he built his own home on land in the Gungahlin district.
