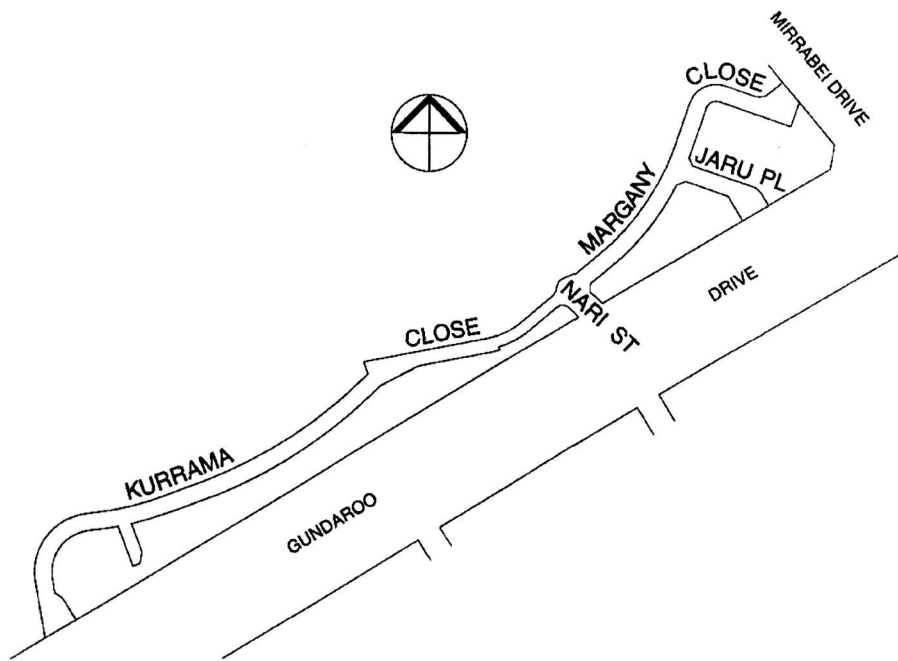
### **STREET NOMENCLATURE**

#### **Division of Ngunnawal: Notable Aborigines and Aboriginal Words**

<b>NAME</b>	<b>ORIGIN</b>	<b>SIGNIFICANCE</b>
Nari Street	Aboriginal tribe	The Nari Nari was an Aboriginal tribal unit whose homeland was south of the junction of the Lachlan and Murrumbidgee Rivers, NSW. The explorer Charles Sturt met the Nari Nari in 1830.
Kurrama Close	Aboriginal tribe	An Aboriginal tribal group of the Hammersley Ranges area in Western Australia.
Margany Close	Aboriginal tribe	An Aboriginal tribal group of south-western Queensland. Their homeland is in the vicinity of the upper Paroo and lower Bulloo Rivers.
Jaru Place	Aboriginal tribe	An Aboriginal tribal group of the desert region in the Halls Creek area of the Kimberley in Western Australia.
