ROAD TRANSPORT (GENERAL) ACT 1999

**DECLARATION THAT AUSTRALIAN ROAD RULE NO. 185 DOES
NOT APPLY TO DRIVERS OF CERTAIN VEHICLES**

INSTRUMENT NO. 359 OF 2000

Pursuant to subsection 13(1) of the *Road Transport (General) Act 1999* ('the Act'),
I declare that Australian Road Rule No. 185 (Stopping in a permit zone) does not apply to a driver
of a declared vehicle stopped in a declared permit zone.

declared permit zone means a permit zone as described in the schedule attached.

declared vehicle means a vehicle as described in the schedule attached.

This instrument commences operation on 1 January 2001.

SCHEDULE

Declared Vehicle	Declared Permit Zone
A motor vehicle used by the Commonwealth Government or a Commonwealth Authority while displaying number plates commencing with the capital letter 'Z' with the capital letter 'Z' having a red colour.	Government Vehicles
A motor vehicle used by the Commonwealth Department of Defence while displaying number plates that identify the vehicle as being a vehicle used by the Department of Defence.	Government Vehicles
A motor vehicle used by the Australian Capital Territory Government or an Australian Capital Territory Authority while displaying number plates commencing with the numbers in the range of 200 to 299 with the numbers having a red colour.	Government Vehicles
A Police vehicle displaying the insignia or the markings of the Australian federal Police.	Government Vehicles
An emergency vehicle displaying the insignia or the markings of ACT Emergency Services.	Government Vehicles
A motor vehicle used by a foreign embassy or foreign mission while displaying blue background number plates either commencing with the capital letters 'DC' or 'DX'.	Diplomatic Vehicles
