Determination of Fees and Charges for 2001/2002 – Attorney-General

COMBINED DETERMINATION OF FEES AND EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM

Explanatory Note: This document sets out a number of the fees and charges administered by the Department of Justice & Community Safety, the responsibility of the Attorney-General. Previously, these were contained in a number of separate documents. For ease of reference, these have been combined within a single document that includes both the determination and explanatory notes.

INSTRUMENT NO. 105 OF 2001

- 1. This determination may be cited as Determination of Fees and Charges for 2001/2002 Attorney-General.
- 2. This determination comes into operation on 1 July 2001 with the exception of items 1 11 of Schedule 3 to this determination relating to the <u>Agents Act 1968</u> which come into operation on the date on which this instrument is notified in the Australian Capital Territory Gazette.
- 3. I **REVOKE** each set out in Schedule 1. Schedule 2 sets out, in relation to each item in Schedule 1, the legislative authority under which the revocation is made.
- 4. I **DETERMINE** the fees set out in Schedule 3. Schedule 2 sets out, in relation to each item in Schedule 3, the legislative authority under which the determination is made.
- 5. The payment of the fee may be deferred in accordance with Schedule 3 where applicable.
- 6. Explanatory notes (including the previous years fee) are included in the schedules in italic text. General explanatory notes are included at the end of schedules in italic text. Explanatory notes in italic text and general explanatory notes in italic text do not form part of the determination. (For example, the following twelve words, if included in a schedule, would not form part of the determination: *Explanatory Note: explanatory notes and general explanatory notes are in italic text*).

General Explanatory Notes

A. Overview of changes to the gazetting of fees and charges

The Department of Justice and Community Safety has implemented a system of notifying all relevant fees and charges in a single determination relating to each Minister rather than the multiple determinations under each individual Act that have been produced in previous years. This system should enable the community to access information on fees and charges applicable to the Department from only two determinations rather than the up 20 individual determinations that have been in force previously. The two determinations represent the fees which are the responsibility of:

B. Citation of Statutory Instruments

This Determination uses on the citation of statutory instruments provisions of Section 52(1)(b)(i) of the <u>Interpretation Act 1667</u> to revoke the previous determinations for fees and charges. The contents of Section 52are extracted below for easier reference:

- 52 *Citation of statutory instruments*
 - (1) A statutory instrument may be cited—
 - (a) by its citation or other name; or
 - *(b)* by reference to—
 - (i) for an instrument that has been published or notified in the Gazette—the number, date and page or pages of the Gazette in which it was published or notified; or
 - (ii) for any other instrument—the date when it was made, together with a reference to the Act or statutory instrument under which it was made.

(2) An instrument made under a Commonwealth Act, or under an instrument made under a Commonwealth Act, may be cited—

- (a) by its citation or other name; or
- (b) in another way sufficient in a Commonwealth Act for the citation of such an instrument;

together with a reference to the Commonwealth (or an abbreviation of the Commonwealth).

(3) An instrument made under an Act or ordinance of a State or another Territory, or under an instrument made under such an Act or ordinance, may be cited—

(a) by its citation or other name; or

(b) in another way sufficient in an Act or ordinance of the State or other Territory for the citation of such an instrument;

together with (unless it is a New South Wales instrument applying in the Territory) a reference to the State or other Territory (or an abbreviation of it).

(4) An instrument made under a UK Act, or under an instrument made under a UK Act, may be cited—

- (a) by its citation or other name; or
- (b) in another way sufficient in a UK Act for the citation of such an instrument;

together with (unless it is a UK instrument applying in the Territory) a reference to the United Kingdom (or an abbreviation of the United Kingdom).

The effect of clause 3 of the determination and Schedule 1 is to revoke each Determination cited in Schedule 1. The Legislative Authority for the revocation for each Legislative Authority under which the Statutory Instrument was made is obtained by reference to the Legislative Authority and Section in Schedule 2 relating to each item number listed in Schedule 1. For example, Clause 3 of this determination will revoke under Regulation 31 of the Adoption Regulations, Determination No 198 of 2000 which was notified on Page 662 of the Australian Capital Territory Gazette No. 26 of 29 June 2000. Similarly, Clause 4 of this determination will determine under the power of Regulation 31 of the Adoption, that the fees payable for the purposes of the Adoption Regulations are as set out in item 101 of Schedule 3 to this determination.
