### ROAD TRANSPORT (GENERAL) ACT 1999

#### DECLARATION THAT PART 10 OF THE ROAD TRANSPORT (GENERAL) ACT 1999 DOES NOT APPLY TO CERTAIN VEHICLES AND PERSONS

#### INSTRUMENT NO. 107 OF 2001

Pursuant to subsection 13(1) of the *Road Transport (General) Act 1999* ('the Act'),  
I declare that Part 10 of the Act does not apply to:

- (a) The owner of any competing vehicle;
- (b) Any competing vehicle;
- (c) Any driver while driving or in control of a competing vehicle;
- (d) The owner of any support vehicle while the vehicle is being used in a designated activity;
- (e) The driver of any support vehicle while the vehicle is being used in a designated activity;

This declaration shall be for the period from the first moment of Friday 8 June 2001 to the last moment of Sunday 10 June 2001.

For this declaration, the following definitions apply:

Event	means the GMC 400 V8 Supercar race including all support events, trials and practice runs held from 8 June 2001 to 10 June 2001.
Competing vehicle	means any vehicle used or intended to be used for competing in the event.
Support vehicle	means a vehicle the use of which is required by or incidental to the event, including but not limited to, tow trucks, pace cars and environmental vehicles, but does not include fire vehicles and ambulances.

Designated activity	means an activity that forms part of the event but only while the activity takes place in the red zone.
Driver	means a person who is a driver, co-driver or passenger.
Red zone	means any area between the crowd control fences, including the pit area and racetrack as illustrated in the attached map.
